"Nonmetallic mineral" means a product, commodity or material consisting principally of naturally occurring, organic or inorganic, nonmetallic, nonrenewable material. Nonmetallic minerals include, but are not limited to stone, sand, gravel, asbestos, beryl, diamond, clay, coal, feldspar, peat, talc and topsoil.

Conditions and/or reasons for approval/denial:

This site exemption request shall be approved under the following conditions:

- 1. The pond must be completed within 1 year.
- Total disturbed area must affect less than one acre. If exemption issued for more than one acre disturbed with no material leaving site – DNR storm water permitting is also needed and is the responsibility of the landowner or operator.
- 3. If the owner/operator at any time cannot meet the conditions, they shall notify the Land Conservation Department and may be required to obtain a Nonmetallic Mining Reclamation Permit. A fine would be issued at that time.
- 4. This is only the Wood Co. Land & Water Conservation Dept. exemption for mine site reclamation permitting. It is the landowner or operator responsibility to contact the DNR, Army Corps., Wood Co. Planning and Zoning, and Township to obtain any other necessary permits.
