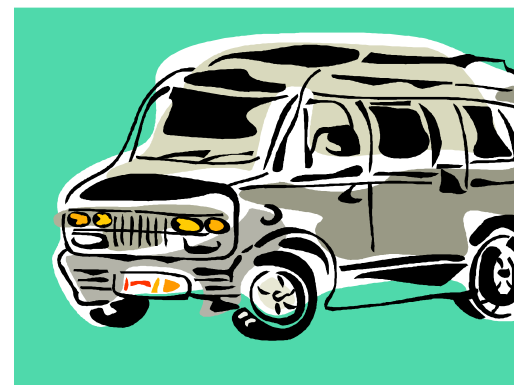

Children's Disability and Resource Centers; Services are Free and Confidential

Children's Disability and Resource Center 421-0480 or 387-2326 or cdrc@cssw.org Children's Service Society of Wisconsin serves as your point of entry for the complex system of children's resources in Wood County; specializing in resource referral assistance for children's special needs from birth through age 22.

Northern CYSHCN Regional Center 866-640-4106 will help you get answers, find services and connect you to community resources.

Wood County Unified Services Family Support

Provides services to families raising a child with severe disabilities. Referral assistance is provided to maximize use of community resources and strengthen natural support systems. Limited funding is available for home modifications, transportation, specialized equipment and respite. Service priority is given to families in a crisis situation or bringing a child home from an out-of-home facility.

Forward Card/ Badger Care Card Transportation Benefits

Your economic support worker, at your request, will establish an account that reimburses travel expenses for medical appointments paid by the Forward Card. This includes medical, therapy, mental health and dental appointments. The economic support worker **requires 5 days advance notice** of the appointment date to mail the required paperwork. The client is responsible for locating or providing the means of transportation, maintaining a log of mileage to/from the appointment. The service provider must sign this paperwork for transportation reimbursement. The program reimburses mileage costs (per mile rate changes annually) and paid at the end of the month after the economic support worker receives your provider signed paperwork.

Aging & Disability Resource Center of Central Wisconsin

Provides information and assistance to adults and their families; (ages 17 years, 9 months and older) with physical or developmental disabilities. Legal advocacy is provided for rights, benefits, and entitlement denials. The center determines client needs through assessment of medical, financial, and social information and includes long-term care options for counseling, future planning, and program eligibility.
