1. Chairman A. Breu called the meeting to order at 8:00 A.M.

2. Public comments:

Jim Griesbach, Highway Commissioner for Marathon County, was in attendance. He thanked the committee and Wood County Highway Commissioner Douglas Passineau for their quick response and support when they had a fire in one of their shops and lost a building. The Wood County Highway Department opened up its Marshfield shop to an employee from Marathon County to help ease some of the displacement pressures their outlying shops were receiving since the fire.

Darrell Kauth from United Special Sportsman Alliance, Inc (USSA) was in attendance to discuss the upkeep of two disabled hunting blinds that were built on Wood County Forest Land. The blinds were built as part of an Eagle Scout project. Kauth offered volunteer assistance from the USSA for upkeep of the blinds if the Park and Forestry Department would be able to provide some type of signage to deter individuals who are not in need of the disabled hunting blinds from using them. The Committee approved Fritz Schubert, Forest Administrator, to explore the legalities of posting part of Wood County Forest Land closed to unauthorized members of the public, and what other options may be available.

At this time, the Committee jumped to agenda item 6.d. Following the discussion of 6.d., the Committee jumped to agenda item 7.b. Following 7.b., the Committee resumed the agenda on item 3.

3. The minutes of the November 05, 2015 Highway Infrastructure & Recreation Committee meetings were reviewed.

A motion was made by T. Miner and seconded by D. Polach to approve the above-mentioned minutes. Motion carried.

PARKS:

Design Unlimited had attended the November 05 meeting to present their proposal for the new Powers Bluff Shelter Building. Park and Forestry Director Chad Schooley reviewed this information and provided a preliminary business plan. The Committee requested that Schooley develop a fundraising plan.

b. Dexter Park/ Forestry shop construction discussion

Schooley showed videos of the Dexter Park/Forestry shop and the Committee discussed the construction of a new shop complex south of the Dexter Park Campground entrance. There would be two buildings — one a heated shop with office area, and the other a cold storage building. There is money set aside in Capital Improvement for next year for this construction. There are other funding sources that the Department is considering at this time as well. The Committee directed Parks and Forestry to move forward with plans to build the new buildings at Dexter Park.

c. "No Firewood" draft policy

Schooley presented a draft Firewood Restriction Ordinance that would restrict park users from bringing in firewood from outside the parks.

A motion was made by D. Polach and seconded by T. Miner to move forward with the resolution process for adopting the Firewood Restriction Ordinance and thereby approving the preliminary ordinance. Motion carried.

- d. Special Use Permits.
 - i. Aqua Skiers
 - July 21-24th, 2016
 Setup is the weekend prior and will have shelter reserved through the 26th.
 - World Water Ski Show
 September 9-11th, 2016
 Some setup and practicing prior. Will have a similar contract to what is created for the State Water Ski Show.
 - Calendar of dates

Aqua Skiers provided a calendar of dates in 2016 for which they would like the Red Sands Beach on Lake Wazeecha closed and which dates they would like lake closures as well. Lake closures for Lake Wazeecha have to be approved by the Town of Grand Rapids. Jason Sachs from the Aqua Skiers was present to discuss the calendar. There was some concern that the lake closures would cause conflict with other user groups, but the dates for closures will be shared with the public. The Special Use Permit covers the beach closures.

A motion was made by T. Miner and seconded by M. Hokamp to approve the Aqua Skiers Special Use Permits and to direct the Parks and Forestry Director to review fees and agreements. Motion carried.

- ii. Kiwanis Club Youth Outdoors Day at Nepco Lake Park January 16th, 2016 from 10:00 A.M. to 3:00 P.M. The Club will pay a four hour fee for use of the Shelter Building. The Parks and Forestry Department has provided \$2 off coupons to participants for use at Powers Bluff in the past.
- iii. Port Edwards Lions Fishery January 31st, 2016
- iv. 42nd Annual Pittsville Lions Fisheree, Dexter Park, shelter fee waived for event, February 7, 2016.
- v. Lake Dexter Ice Races
 February 14th, 2016 (setup on the 13th)
 They do not use the shelter building.

- vi. Jigsaw Walk/Run for Autism Awareness
 May 7th, 2016. Red Sands Beach Pavilion and Enclosed Shelter
 rented for event. Walk trail around lake is route used.
- vii. I Walk for Life (Pregnancy Resource Center)
 May 14th, 2016
 They rent the enclosed shelter. The walk trail around lake is route used.

A motion was made by T. Miner and seconded by D. Polach to approve the above listed Special Use Permits. Motion carried.

A motion was made by T. Miner and seconded by M. Hokamp to approve the Park and Forestry Director's report. Motion carried.

FORESTRY:

Futurewood representative John Kundinger was present for this portion of the meeting and provided a letter requesting an extension of their contract. Forestry Administrator Fritz Schubert recommended extension of the above listed contract with no increase in stumpage.

A motion was made by T. Miner and seconded by D. Polach to approve the extension of contract for #703 for Futurewood with no increase in stumpage. Motion carried.

c. Land Trade Proposal/Discussion.

Schultz proposed a land trade with a landowner in Town of Remington. The Forestry Department would acquire a 104 acre parcel and the landowner would receive an 80 acre parcel. An appraisal needs to be completed. The Committee directs the Forest Administrator to move forward with the land appraisals.

d. Enbridge Pipeline Maintenance Dig/Agreement

Enbridge has indicated they have a section of pipeline behind the shooting range that is in need of maintenance. The agreement for the dig has been approved by Corporation Counsel.

A motion was made by D. Polach and seconded by B. Winch to approve the Enbridge Pipeline Maintenance Dig Agreement. Motion carried.

A motion was made by T. Miner and seconded by D. Polach to approve the Forest Administrator's report. Motion carried.

8. Correspondence.

The permitted trapper at harvested around 20 muskrats on Lake Wazeecha and 30 on Nepco Lake.

Parks and Forestry Department will be reimbursed by the Wisconsin Department of Transportation for the hours spent lowering the water level at Dexterville.

There have been no accidents or injuries by Park and Forestry employees for the month of November.

Discussion on the Park Ordinance prohibiting dogs in the parks without leashes: many people will let their dogs off leash except when park employees are near. The Department has not pushed enforcement on this issue, but as it is becoming more of an issue, they would like the Committee's approval to step up enforcement. The Committee recommended enforcing the ordinance, but do so after communicating with Grand Rapids and the Sheriff Department regarding support in doing so.

9. Approve payment of bills.

10. Revenue report.

The Highway Department has submitted applications seeking funding on the following projects under the County Highway Improvement Program with the Wisconsin DOT:

- 1. Approximately \$200,000 for the bridge on CTH T under CHIP
- 2. Approximately \$245,000 for CTH Y 1 mile west of Marshfield under CHIP-D

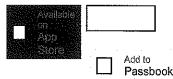

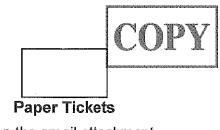
