1. Call to Order:

Dennis Polach called the meeting to order at 9:02 a.m.

2. <u>Review minutes of December 10, 2018:</u>

Motion by Feirer, second by Zurfluh to approve the minutes of the December 10, 2018 meeting as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

3. <u>Public Comments:</u>

4. Discuss Printer Management Program:

Amy Kaup, from IT, talked about the contract with EO Johnson expiring in the next few months. Amy stated the cost of equipment will come from IT and the departments should see cost savings in 2020. Lori Heideman and Steve Kreuser stated this program will save their departments money.

6. Emergency Management Department:

8. <u>Dispatch Department:</u>

b. Dispatch Report:

The Committee reviewed the Dispatch report. Lori stated she has hired two dispatchers in the month of January.

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c. Phones:

Lori stated Raycom requested a meeting and the company stated they sold the hardware to another company, but kept the software. Lori stated this means the new phone system is unsupported. Lori and Erik stated they have parts and pieces if the phone system would go down; however if there is a major catastrophic failure the lead time could be a couple of months. Lori stated if something does happen to the phone system the backup goes to Portage and Adams County.

Joe Zurfluh stated this item needs to be brought back for February's meeting and he stated he wanted Lori and Erik to get quotes for new phone systems.

Erik also stated if a new phone system was purchased the committee could think about putting the old system at Norwood for emergencies.

9. <u>Coroner:</u>

Sheriff Becker stated he is looking forward to working with everyone. He stated his Administrative staff will be attending the meetings going forward.

Sheriff Becker talked about a search warrant in the Town of Sherry.

Sheriff Becker talked about Deputy Douglas Christianson receiving CIT Officer of the Year for his involvement in the CIT program, which is a community initiative designed to improve the outcomes of police interactions with people living with mental illnesses. He stated the award will be displayed in the Sheriff's Department.

Sheriff Becker recognized Tony Kuhlka for his 25 years of service with the Sheriff's Department.

Sheriff Becker stated at this time there is no snowmobile patrol due to having no snow.

Sheriff Becker stated he will be meeting with the Civil Service Commission regarding a new Deputy Sheriff eligibility list.

b. December 2018 Claims:

The Committee reviewed the Sheriff's Department December 2018 claims.

c. Updates:

Crimestoppers: See Report.

K9: Sheriff Becker stated K9 Toro would be retiring in late summer 2019. Sheriff Becker also talked about the ACACIA foundation and bringing other agencies aboard.

Jason Zaleski asked about a lapse in services when K9 Toro leaves. Sheriff Becker stated this may happen due to the availability of training.

Courthouse Security: Sheriff Becker talked about staffing the new security once it is in place with the Sheriff's Department or a private company. Sheriff Becker stated he has a quote from Per Mar Security Services regarding staffing the new security. Sheriff Becker stated the drawback of staffing privately is no arrest powers.

Rueben VanTassel, Maintenace Department, stated he hopes by early summer the main entrance will have an X-Ray machine, metal detectors, and an office for personnel. He stated in the next three months people should start seeing some changes.

Joe Zurfluh stated he would like to see law enforcement doing the courthouse security.

Jason Zaleski agreed with Joe Zurfluh and asked Sheriff Becker about pricing with Per Mar Security Services.

Mike Feirer and Dennis Polach both agreed they would like to see law enforcement doing the courthouse security.

d. Jail Items:

vi. New Jail: The Committee discussed where to start the talks about a new jail.

vii. Space Needs in Jail: Captain Ashbeck talked about how temporary housing works in the jail setting.

Chief Deputy Dorshorst talked about EMP. He said at times the Jail has to pay for inmates to be on EMP on account of overcrowding and the inmates not being able to pay to be on the program. He noted that the strategy resulted with a considerable cost savings versus contacting additional housing.

Rueben talked about the money being spent to fix the infrastructure and the equipment in the jail now and in the future. He stated money spent could be allocated for the new jail instead of fixing the old jail.
