6 beds	No limit	Women; children and family may visit during the day.	Individuals must be 30 days clean/sober. They must complete an application and interview. A \$70.00 deposit and one week of rent is required for admission to the house.	ABSOLUTE SOBRIETY is required! Individuals will pay rent at a rate of \$10.00/day. It is paid bi-weekly. Weekly house meetings and attendance of recovery meetings per week are required. Anyone staying is subject to random urinalyses, breathalyzer, room searches, and canine drug searches.

Each family/individual will be screened with program staff interviews and the Vulnerability Index Service Prioritization Decision Assistance Tool (VI-SPDAT), which helps identify who should be recommended for housing and support intervention programs that are available in the area.	Access to a case manager and individualized growth plans. Services include: support and education in building independent living skills, budgeting, and tenancy skills; assistance with integrating into the community; and connections to community-based health care and treatment, employment services, social security benefits, and other community resources. Once a family has the skills and resources to live independently, they will be assisted in finding permanent, safe, affordable housing and may continue case management.

Individuals in transition (e.g., released from jail, people in recovery) can stay in a transitional room for \$80 per week.	Provides clients with food, clothing, hygiene products, and shelter.

Additional resources are offered to assist with housing difficulties to prevent homelessness or address current homelessness.	For rental assistance: Individuals must be a resident of the county utilizing the fund. They must not have utilized the rental assistance services within the past 12 months. Recipients must be facing homelessness or currently homeless (e.g., eviction notice) as well as have a source of income.

Grant funds available to waive rent temporarily while seeking employment.	Offers a supportive way of living and opportunities to learn skills in an alcohol and drug-free environment.

They also offer a 9-month healing program for women (and their children) who are caught in the cycle of domestic abuse or alcohol/drug-related addiction. After women graduate from the 9-month program, they can apply to live in the Recovery Center.

Emergency Shelter provides safe environment, bed, shower, meal, clothing, and connection to resources. 9-month program includes morning devotions, case management, classes, mentoring, recovery meetings, church attendance and chores. Women in the Recovery Center secure employment, go to school, or apply to serve as an intern.

A separate designated area is available for crisis stays.

The Family Center's primary responsibility is to provide safe shelter 24/7 for people who are in crisis as a result of domestic violence. The shelter is a home-like environment in a secured building, and it provides a safe environment as well as assistance with food, transportation, clothing, and other basic needs. While at The Family Center, advocates work closely with clients and their families to explore options and to provide emotional support, legal advocacy, children's support services, and to determine longer-term housing options. The Family Center is handicap accessible.

Over 200 women of many backgrounds have called The Hannah Center their home. The Hannah Center has an Urgent Housing Room that is typically available within 1-3 days of applying, as well as an Individual Goal-Based Program.
