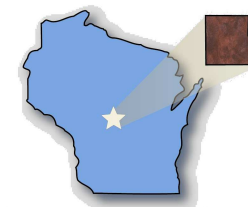

- Assistance getting the health care you need
- Personal support

WHAT IS PRENATAL CARE COORDINATION?

Prenatal care coordination is a benefit offered through Wisconsin Medicaid (BadgerCare) that helps pregnant women get the support and services they need to have a healthy baby. You will be visited by a Public Health Nurse either at your home or at the Health Department. All information is kept confidential.

What Questions Can the Nurse Answer?

- What will labor and delivery be like?
- Should I breastfeed my baby?
- How do I find a doctor?
- How do I apply for WIC?
- How do I get help with housing needs?
- Are there any community services that can help me?
- Is my car seat installed correctly?
- Are vaccines safe?
- And many more!
