Tree and Shrub Descriptions

Blue Spruce -*Picea pungens* (Tree) 40-60 feet mature size. Stiff silvery blue to green needles. Handsome ornamental planted singly or dense as screen or windbreak. Will grow in full sun to partial shade and moist to dry soils. Recommended spacing is 10-15 feet.

Elderberry - *Sambucus nigra* L. ssp. *canadensis* (Shrub) 10-12 feet mature height. White flowers produce small purple berries. Excellent summer wildlife food and cover especially for songbirds. Fruit is edible by humans (used for wines and jellies). Broad tolerance to sun and shade, soil types and moisture conditions, prefers moist sites. Recommended spacing is 4-6 feet.

Hybrid Poplar –*Populus Deltoids x Populus Nigra* (Tree) 60-80 feet mature height. Once established the hybrids can grow 4-6 feet a year. Hybrid poplar will not survive in shade. Arid areas of sites that have standing water all summer are not usually suitable for hybrids. The roots of hybrid poplar should be planted at least 1 foot deep. Recommended spacing is 10-15 feet.

Norway Spruce – *Picea Abies* (Tree) Grows over 35 feet. Fastest growing spruce with dark green needles and draping branches, Good ornamental or windbreak tree. Grows well in most conditions. Recommended spacing is 10-15 feet.

Red Osier Dogwood – *Cornus sericea* (Shrub) 8-10 feet mature height. Has white flowers atop of bright red twigs that produce white berries persisting into winter. Provides food and cover to ruffed grouse, turkeys, cardinals, evening grosbeaks, and rabbits to name a few. Tolerates full sun to full shade. Prefers wet to moist soil, broad range of tolerance to soil types. Recommended spacing is 4-6 feet.

Serviceberry - *Amelanchier Laevis* (Shrub) 10-30 feet mature size. Small, upright multi-stemmed tree. Soil and moisture type widely adaptable. Full sun to partial shade. White flowers followed by purplish-blue fruit, delicious in pies and jams. Orange-red fall foliage.

Silver Maple-*Acer saccharinum* (Tree) 75-100 feet mature height. Silver maples grow at an extremely fast pace in relation to other trees. The seeds serve as an abundant food source for many birds and small animals. Silver Maples are noted as a preferred nesting tree for Baltimore orioles, cavity nesting birds and mammals. Recommended spacing is 15-20 feet.

Swamp White Oak - *Quercus bicolor* (Tree) 75-100 feet mature size. Swamp white oaks adapt to a variety of soil types and conditions. These trees also tolerate significant soil compaction and are resistant to oak wilt. Provides cover for a variety of birds and mammals. Wildlife including squirrels, mice, deer and a variety of birds are attracted to the sweet acorns that are produced. Recommended spacing 15-20 feet.

White Pine -*Pinus Strobus* (Tree) 50-100 feet mature height. Needles are 3-5 inches long occurring in bundles of 5. Frequent nest site of numerous species of birds. White Pine is ideal for wildlife cover due to its rapid growth. Grows on sandy soils and rocky ridges, but prefers fertile well-drained soils. Recommended spacing is 10-15 feet.
