- 1. Call meeting to order. Meeting called to order by Supervisor Breu at 8:01 am.
- 2. Public comments.

Supervisor Clendenning expressed his discontent with the length of time that roads are staying closed when the County Highway Department does work on them. He explained that people will get tickets for going on closed roads and insurance won't pay if an accident occurs on a closed road. He had already spoken to Commissioner Doug Passineau on the issue. Passineau stated that there are times when a road does need to be closed, but it is understandable when people are upset that a road is closed for a long time. He stated it is an internal issue that has already been discussed and dealt with. Clendenning also stated that municipalities need to make sure they inform the State or County when they are going to be working in their right-of-way. Passineau stated there is a permit process for that that they would need to follow. Supervisor Breu suggested bringing it up at a Towns' Association meeting.

3. Approve minutes of the July 10, 2017 Highway, Infrastructure, and Recreation Committee meeting(s) and approve minutes of the April 4, 2017 Wood County Wildlife Area Advisory Committee meeting.

Supervisor Winch stated that on page six paragraph four of the HIRC minutes; it states that there are not lights or arms at the railroad crossing on County Highway T and that there would be a significant cost to the Village to install them. He stated there are arms and lights installed there already. It was restated that should quad arms be installed or if the arms had to move, that would be an additional cost to the Village. Winch requested that the minutes be amended to reflect this clarification.

Motion to approve the minutes of the July 10, 2017 HIRC meeting as amended and the August 4, 2017 Wood County Wildlife Area Advisory Committee Meeting by D. LaFontaine and seconded by M. Hokamp. All in favor. Motion carried.

At this time, the Committee addressed item number 11 on the agenda, "Village of Hewitt Quiet Zone".

Following the discussion of item 11, they took a break from 9:27 A.M. and resumed at 9:35 A.M. to address item 6.d. Special Use Permits.

Following that discussion, they returned to the regular agenda with item 4 "Parks Construction Supervisor Report".

W. Winch stated he would like the fiscal note to include mention of the fact that it is a 100% reimbursement from the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources and Consolidated Musky Club.

Motion to approve the County Conservation Grant resolution with a fiscal note amendment to include language regarding reimbursement of the grant made by W. Winch and seconded by D. LaFontaine. All in favor. Motion carried.

b. Parks, Recreation and Open Spaces Plan Update

Schooley stated that the Planning and Zoning Department would like a motion from the committee to proceed with the Parks, Recreation, and Open Spaces Plan that is required to obtain various grant fundings.

Motion to begin the process of updating the Parks, Recreation, and Open Spaces Plan made by J. Zurfluh and seconded by W. Winch. All in favor. Motion carried.

Draft of Park Ordinance updates

Schooley stated he included the draft for the Committee's review. Final approval will be in September.

Motion to approve the draft ordinance and direct the Park and Forestry Director to bring back to the committee for final approval in September made by D. LaFontaine and seconded by M. Hokamp. All in favor. Motion carried.

d. Special Use Permits.

Maxine's Sweet Treats
 Presented by Maxine Kremer
 Permit to drive through campgrounds and sell novelty ice cream out of her ice cream truck.

Schooley stated some questions had come up at the last HIRC meeting and since that Maxine was not present to address and he would like her to address them at this time. Schooley stated his concern was safety of the campers and finding a way to limit the permit so that not just any business could access the parks for the purposes of their business. He stated they don't currently have a process to address this type of seller's permit and it has always been handled on a case by case basis.

Kremer stated she believed it would take her one to one and a half hours to drive through a park. She would only like to do this on Saturdays between 6:00 pm and 8:00 pm or 2:00 pm to 4:00 pm. Given that the camping season is almost over, she would like any kind of fee waived for this year and the matter of a fee discussed for the next year. Schooley stated he had considered a season fee for access but would not like to charge it for the remainder of this year. Kremer stated she currently sells within a variety of villages and towns in Wood County. They usually charge between \$10-\$15 for an annual seller's permit.

Schooley inquired about the music and her insurance levels.

Kremer stated the music can be turned down and there are a variety of songs/sounds so that it doesn't get too repetitive. She currently holds food liability insurance, truck insurance, a Wisconsin Seller's Permit, and does annual health inspections. She would be able to provide copies of all the policies/permits/inspections results upon request.

Schooley stated that the Special Use Permit language does require liability insurance of \$1 million with Wood County named as "additionally insured".

LaFontaine asked what parks she would sell at. Kremer stated North Wood County Park and Dexter.

Motion to allow Maxine's Sweet Treats to sell ice cream in the county parks subject to rules and regulations that the Parks Director set forth made by J. Zurfluh and seconded by D. LaFontaine. All in favor. Motion carried.

 Multi-Metro Deer Management South Wood County Park Repeat permit.

Motion to approve the Special Use Permits by D. LaFontaine and seconded by J. Zurfluh, All in favor. Motion carried.

Schooley provided a draft budget to the committee and wants the Committee to review it and get a hold of him if they have questions/concerns. Schooley would like to have it approved in September. Schooley also brought up his concerns with future budgets in regards to general operating costs and Capital Improvement items. He would like the committee to consider an option that would continue allotting the normal annual tax levy amount, with annual increases if possible, to cover a portion of the general operations budget. He would like all dollars that remain at the end of the year, in excess of the budgeted tax levy amount because of excess revenues or unspent expenses, to be placed in the non-lapsing Capital Projects account. This account would then be used for Capital Improvements, as well as for 50/50 cost share grant projects. The Committee agreed that this should be pursued more and instructed Schooley to draft a resolution to that effect. Motion to approve the Park and Forestry Director report by D. LaFontaine and seconded by J. Zurfluh. All in favor, Motion carried.

HIGHWAY:

11. Village of Hewitt Quiet Zone

Dan Borchardt from MSA Professional Services was present to talk on behalf of the Village of Hewitt. He stated that on July 12th, the Village of Hewitt and he met with the Village of Hewitt Fire Chief, Brian Haferman, regarding the 60% plan for the proposed quiet zone. Following this meeting, the Fire Department submitted a letter of comments about the proposed plan. MSA wrote up a response letter and presented that to the committee and the Fire Department today.

Borchardt went on to address some of the concerns that the Fire Department had expressed.

1. Closure of Apple Ln
Borchardt stated that the Federal Railroad Administration stated the
improvements made to the intersection would actually be safer with Apple Lane
closed. The FRA did not onsider having a drivable curb to be a safe
improvement.

2. Turn around in a dead end
Borchardt stated that Haferman had come up with a plan to address how the fire
department would deal with a fire happening on Apple Ln.

3. Pedestrians on CTH T and conflicts with Implements of Husbandry (IOH)
Borchardt stated this issue would be addressed by drivers yielding to bikers and
pedestrians if the situation called for it. He did not see where widened shoulders
would improve the safety for pedestrians.

At this time, the committee discussed the matter of pedestrian and driving traffic conflict further. Borchardt clarified that the road does not have a designated bike path. It is currently bike accessible which just means that it has widened shoulders. To create a designated bike path, it would need to be signed and painted accordingly. Furthermore, pedestrian accommodations need to be kept separate from bike accommodations. In other words, there would need to be a sidewalk for the road to properly accommodate pedestrians. That is not currently in the plans.

Marlene Stucland of the Village of Hewitt Board stated that safety, health, and the welfare of their citizens is of the utmost concern and regard. They have to consider both how to make the area safe and how to improve the health and well-being of their citizens. She asked if there was a way to put up a "yield to pedestrians and bikers" sign there. Passineau stated there was a signage standard that would apply there, but he is not certain that it would allow for that type of signage.

Motion to approve the Village of Hewitt Quiet Zone on CTH T application made by W. Winch.

Breu stated he would like to hear from the Fire Department at this time.

Brian Haferman, Village of Hewitt Fire Chief, was present to represent the Fire Department. Haferman stated he just received the MSA response letter and would like more time to review it.

Breu stated he would like to hold a special meeting to discuss this subject. He stated he would like the Fire Department and the Village of Hewitt to come to an agreement before the County made a decision on the matter.

Stucland stated the Fire Department would be responsible for coming up with a workable plan to address their fire needs with the revised intersection.

Passineau stated that any time there are changes to access on a County road; it is always a concern for the Highway Department. He stated the 60% plan as he saw it was acceptable, but there is obviously still some confusion between the Village and the Fire Department.

Motion to grant the authority for approval of the CTH T Village of Hewitt Quiet Zone to Douglas Passineau, Highway Commissioner, on the condition that the Village of Hewitt and the Village of Hewitt Fire Department provide a plan to him by September 10th, 2017 made by D. LaFontaine.

W. Winch withdrew his previous motion.

W. Winch seconded the motion made by D. LaFontaine.

Supervisor Zurfluh asked if Passineau had the statutory authority to approve the plan. Passineau stated that yes, he does.

All in favor. Motion carried.

12. Highway Department's Draft Budget

John Peckham shared the draft budget with the committee and he would be bringing it back for final review in September.

Motion to review the draft budget and revisit at the September HIRC meeting made by D. LaFontaine and seconded by J. Zurfluh. All in favor. Motion carried,

13. Frac Sand update.

Passineau received a call from Mr. Tom Giardani from Completion Materials. They had filed Chapter 11 on Tuesday and are in the process of trying to sell. Our Corporation Counsel department is aware of it and is moving forward. Completion currently owes us approximately \$300,000.

- 1. Call meeting to order. Meeting called to order by Supervisor Breu at 2:01 pm.
- 2. Public comments. None.
- 3. Resolution for Capital Projects Funding

Douglas Passineau presented a PowerPoint presentation about the history, impact, and future of debt service funding for capital projects for the Highway Department. The County Board had approved \$2.5 million at their July meeting. However, Passineau stated that the original intent was to approve \$4.4 million: \$1.8 million of which would cover the levy that the County Board had taken from the Highway Department when debt service was started in 2015 and \$2.5 million which would be considered additional to keep the Department on the path towards road rating improvements that the Board had committed to in 2015. Passineau stated that the original plan was for five years of additional debt service funding but because of efficiencies in the Department's operations, he was confident that the goal could be reached with just one more year of additional debt service.

Following his presentation, Supervisor Breu opened the floor for questions from the other County Board Supervisors present. Supervisor Kremer asked if the General Transportation Aid received from the State of Wisconsin goes back into the levy. Passineau stated that no, it comes to the Highway Department and goes into maintenance funding. Supervisor Kremer asked how Governor Walker's budget would impact highway funding. John Peckham stated that when making the budget, the assumption is that things will stay the same.

Mike Martin advised that the County's financial advisors, Joe Murray from Springsted, is concerned that presenting bond service in two resolutions instead of one could pose legal issues. He is currently seeking further input from the bond counsel but has not heard back from them. He will share the results of his inquiry with the Committee and Passineau. Martin did state that even with two resolutions, there would still be one debt issue, so it wouldn't cost any more. The interest rate on the most recent debt issue was 1.8% (Martin checked after the meeting and the actual "net interest rate" was 1.4%).

The resolution presented by the Highway, Infrastructure, and Recreation Committee originally requested "general obligation promissory notes in an amount not to exceed \$2,000,000". The committee decided to amend this to read "in an amount not to exceed \$1,000,000".

Motion by D. LaFontaine to present a resolution for \$1,000,000 of additional general promissory notes for highway capital projects to the County Board and seconded by M. Hokamp. Yes votes: D. LaFontaine, M. Hokamp, J. Zurfluh, A. Breu. No vote: W. Winch. Motion carries.

OFFICE:


- Worked with Rangers every Monday morning to reconcile campground money.

- I met with a couple individuals who live adjacent to South Park who are interested in creating more accessible areas within the park for individuals with disabilities and/or mobility restrictions. I will be meeting more with them in the future to look at different ideas.
- We had our end of season employee meeting and appreciation luncheon on August 9th at North Park. We like to recognize and thank all seasonal employees before they leave for the season. Our staff can be very proud of the jobs they have done maintaining our parks at a top-notch level.
- I continue to meet with Adam D. from P&Z regarding the Parks, Recreation and Open Spaces Plan update. We are currently working on a survey that will be sent out in order to get feedback from the public.
- As was approved at a prior HIRC meeting, I signed an agreement with IMBA
 (International Mountain Biking Association) to provide trail design services for
 the Powers Bluff Development Project. This design work will be funded with our
 annual Ho-Chunk funds that our department receives.
- I met with the Marshfield CVB regarding the Powers Bluff Development Project. They are very excited about the project, and are willing to assist in getting the word out.
- We have hired a diver/engineer to inspect the Dexter Dam spillway apron. During the last inspection, there was concern of possible undercutting of the apron. This inspection will take place on 8/31.
- Staff continues to learn the new TimeStar system. We attended additional training on 8/24.

WOOD COUNTY ORDINANCE #600 WOOD COUNTY PARKS-ORDINANCE

To implement Chapter 27.05 of the Wisconsin Statutes, under which the Wood County Park Highway Infrastructure and Recreation Committee (HIRC). is granted specific powers relative to the supervision and regulation of the use and enjoyment of county praks, subject to the general supervision of the Board of Supervisors, the Wood County Board of Supervisors does ordain as follows:

Chapter 600 .01 GENERAL, ADMINISTRATIVE, AND TERMS

(1) Terms.

A. Park and Forestry Highway Infrastructure and Recreation Committee. The terms "Committee" and "Park and Forestry Committee" shall mean the Wood County Park and Forestry Highway Infrastructure and Recreation Committee, (HIRC). -or its successor.

B. Park. The terms "parks", "County Parks" and "Wood County Parks," are defined to mean all lands and water heretofore and hereafter acquired by the county for pPark or recreational purposes or placed under the jurisdiction of the Park and Forestry Highway Infrastructure and Recreation Committee, and include, without limitations, parks, and privately owned lands, the use of which has been granted to the county for park, recreational, or like public purposes. The following areas are designated as Wood County Parks or Areas managed by the Park and Forestry Highway Infrastructure and Recreation Committee:

C. Person. The term "person" shall include any individual, firm, partnership, corporation and association of persons, and the use of singular form shall include the plural. The use of gender herein includes the masculine and feminine gender.

D. Parks and Forestry Director. The term "Director" shall mean the Parks and Forestry Director shall be the authourized agent of the Committee referred to herein.

C.E. Parks and Forestry Department. The term "Department" shall mean the

- (2) Scope. Except when the context provides otherwise, the provision of this our dinance shall apply to all lands, structures, and property owned, leased or administered by Wood County, Wisconsin, and under the management, supervision, and control of the Wood County Park and Forestry Ccommittee, as established by the Wood County Board of Supervisors and recorded in the "Journal of the Proceedings" of the Wood County Board.
- (3) Park Administrator. The Park Administrator shall be the authorized agent of the Committee referred to herein.

(4)(3) Closing Hours and Dates.

- A. After Hours. It shall be unlawful for any person to be in any designated Wood County prak, between the hours of 10:00 p.m. and the following 8:00 a.m., except for those individuals authorized by permit issued by Park authority.
 - 1. Enclosed Shelter House Closing Time. The area known as the Enclosed Shelter House area of designated Wood County Parks will have an official closing time of 12:00 midnight and shall re-open the following 8:00 a.m. Premises must be cleaned and vacated by 12:00 midnight.
 - 2. After Hours by Permit. All individuals authorized by Park issued permits shall be exempted from the aforementioned, pursuant to said terms of said permit.
- B. After Hours at Boat Landings. Notwithstanding paragraph A, persons are permitted at any hour in South Wood County, Dexter County, and Nepco Lake County Parks for the purpose of and while transporting watercraft to and from designated boat landings.
- C. Park Opening and Closing Dates.
 - 1. Unauthorized Vehicles After Closing Dates. It shall be unlawful for any unauthorized vehicles to enter or be in any Gcounty pPark between the dates of November 1 and April 30, (except as provided herein or in conjunction with the early opening of the campgrounds, or other authorized park activities.)
 - a. Snowmobiles and All_Terrain Vehicles. Snowmobiles and All_Terrain Vehicles (ATV's) are allowed on designated trails only. <u>Designated parking lots and restrooms are open for use.</u>
 - <u>b.</u> Public and Campground Boat Landings. Designated public boat landings may be used at any time for access to the lakes. Campground boat landings are restricted to camper's use only.
 - b.c. Nepco Lake County Park. Due to the year-round facilities and activities available within the park, designated areas are open year round.
 - 2. Campground Opening and Closing Dates. Designated camping areas will be open for camping from May 1 October 31 (except as provided herein).
 - Except when May 1 falls on Saturday, Sunday, Monday, or

b. Except Dexter park campground will be open until the day immediately following November 30 or the end of the deer gun season, whichever is later.

- c. Ski Parking Lots. Designated ski touring trails and skiing parking lots are open for skiing purposes, pursuant to posting by the Wood-County Park and Forestry Ddepartment.
- d. Powers Bluff Winter Sports Area. Powers Bluff Winter Sports Area facilities are open during scheduled hours which are subject to change, pursuant to weather conditions.
- 3. Other areas. Open during scheduled dates and hours as approved by the department Wood County Park and Forestry Committee.

(5)(4) Fees, Charges and Deposits.

- A. Fee Schedule. It shall be unlawful for any person to use any facility, shelter, land or area, for which a fee or charge has been established by the Committee, without payment of such fee or charge in advance, except for open shelters which may be used if not reserved.
- **B.** Special Fees. Any park structure, facility, or area may be reserved or rented for special purposes subject to the approval of the Committee. The Committee, at its' discretion, may set the charge for this facility or area.

(6)(5) Additional Rules, Permits, Exceptions.

- A. Additional Rules. Rules and regulations may be made from time to time by the Committee governing the further use and enjoyment of parks, playgrounds, beaches, boat landings, campgrounds, lakes, streams and the facilities therein. Any person who shall-violates such rules or regulations, or who refuses to subject himself thereto, may be excluded from the use of such facility and be subject to the penalties provided for in this or refuse.
- B. Permits. Any person to whom a permit shall have been issued by the park Director Administrator or other authorized park personnel, shall be bound by the provisions of all Ordinances of Wood County as fully as though the same were inserted in each permit.
- C. Exceptions. Nothing in this code shall prohibit or hinder the Wood County Park and Forestry Committee of Wood County, Wisconsin, its its Administrator, Director. Ppark Ccaretakers, or other duly authorized agents, or any peace officers from performing their official duties.

(7)(6) Installations, Public Utilities and Private Construction.

A. Public Utilities - Location. The location of all sewers and receivers, gas pipes, water pipes, stopcock boxes, hydrants, lamp posts, telephone and electric power posts and lines, manholes, conduit and pumps within any park shall be subject to the jurisdiction and control of the Committee; and their construction, erection, or relocation shall be undertaken only after written permission is received from said committee.

Chapter 600-.02 PUBLIC MEETINGS AND SALES

(1) Public Meetings.

- A. Special Use Permits. Any person desiring to hold a public meeting of any kind whatsoever, in any park shall first obtain a permit from the Committee or its duly authorized agent. The permit must be applied for not less than 48 hours prior to the scheduled event.
- **B.** Permits For Public Assembly. Permits may be granted for the purpose of holding any lawful public assembly in accordance with published regulations governing the reasonable use of the parks.
- (2) **Peddling and Soliciting.** It shall be unlawful for any person to peddle or solicit business of any nature whatever, or to distribute handbills or other advertising matter, to post unauthorized signs or decorative matter on any lands, structures or property for soliciting or conducting business, peddling or providing services within or outside of such lands, structures, or property unless first authorized in writing by the Wood County Parkand Forestry CCommittee_or its duly authorized agent.

Chapter 600-.03 BOATING

- (1) State and Federal Regulations. All federal and state regulations concerned with boating apply to the waters governed by the Gcommittee.
- (2) Beach Mooring. No boats shall be moored closer than 100' to any designated beach area.
- (3) North Wood County Park. No sailboats or boats with motors will be allowed on waters within North Wood County Park.
- (4) Mooring. Overnight Amooring of boats adjacent to Wood County Parks & Forestry lands is prohibited, except for registered campers who utilize designated mooring locations.

Chapter 600-.04 PERSONAL CONDUCT AND NUISANCES

- (1) Personal Conduct. It shall be unlawful for any person to engage in violent, abusive, indecent, profane, boisterous, unreasonably loud, or otherwise disorderly conduct under circumstances in which such conduct tends to cause or provoke a disturbance, or to be so intoxicated that he is unable to care for his own safety, in any county prak.
- (2) Property of Others. It shall be unlawful for any person to destroy, disturb, damage, or remove the property or personal effects of others.
- (3) Unnecessary Noise. It shall be unlawful for any person to operate sound trucks, loud speakers, motors, motorboats, motor vehicles or any other mechanical devices that produce loud noises without first obtaining a written permit from the Committee or its duly authorized agent.

Chapter 600-.05 DESTRUCTION, ENTRY, CLEANING AND REFUSE

(1) Destruction and Entry.

- A. Destruction, Defacement, or Removal. It shall be unlawful for any person to disturb, alter, damage, deface, remove, or destroy any trees, shrubs, plants, or other natural growth; to carve on any rocks, archaeological or geological features, signs, walls, trees or structures; to drive nails or other foreign objects in trees; or to move, injure or deface in any manner any structures including buildings, sign, fences, tables, or other county property. The picking of edible berries. fruits or nuts is permitted.
- **B.** Entry and Manipulation. It shall be unlawful for any person to enter in any building, installation, or area that is under construction or locked or closed to public use; or to alter, damage or manipulate any water control structure, dam, or culvert; or to enter or be upon any building, installation or area after the posted closing time or before the posted opening time, or contrary to posted notice, in any park.

C. Cleaning and Refuse.

1. Washing. The washing of motorized vehicles, persons, pets, cooking utensils, or clothing, is prohibited in any of the lakes or streams, on any picnic grounds, playgrounds, recreation areas, boat landings, parking lots or roadways, or within 50 feet of any pump, fountain, or drinking water outlet in any county park. The washing of persons, cooking utensils and clothing is permitted at designated campgrounds, or at other authorized and posted locations.

- 2. Fish and Game Cleaning. It shall be unlawful for any person to clean, butcher, scale, or skin any fish, game, livestock, or poultry in any County-Ppark except at designated fish-cleaning stations provided for such purposes. Refuse from such cleaning operations must be suitably wrapped or packaged and deposited in the refuse containers provided for that purpose.
- 3. Refuse. No person shall leave or dump any litter, rubbish, debris, dirt, stone, or other materials on County Ppark lands. When garbage receptacles are provided by the department County, only garbage generated on the site and associated with the special activity for which purpose the receptacle was provided may be placed in the receptacle. No personal or private garbage or materials may be deposited in the receptacles.
- 4. Disposal of Hot Charcoal. Charcoal residue must be left in a grate or fireplace until cool, or placed in receptacles provided for such purposes.

Chapter 600-.06 VEHICLES

(1) Vehicular Traffic.

A. Speed Limits in County Parks. No person shall operate any vehicle at a speed in excess of 15 miles per hour or contrary to official traffic signs in any County Park.

B. Reckless Use of A Vehicles In County Parks. No person shall operate any vehicle in any Park in a reckless manner contrary to the provisions of Section.

- C. Unlawful Operating or Parking of Vehicles. It shall be unlawful to operate or park any motor vehicle, except as provided for herein, upon any hiking trail, beach area, playground, picnic area, or any other area other than established roads, parking areas, boat ramps and service areas, or contrary to posted notice, or within any Park when it is seasonally closed to vehicular traffic.
- D. Designated Trails. It shall be unlawful for any person to operate any motor driven sled, toboggan, all_terrain vehicle (ATV) or other snowmobile in any County Park or park area, except on designated trails.
- E. Unlicensed Motorized Vehicles. No person shall operate any unlicensed motorized vehicle ion any County Park on roads, trails, or otherwise. A person with a disability that limits or impairs the ability to walkmobility, as

defined in

§340.01(43g), stats. may may utilize specialized equipment so as long as it that does not cause damage to park property, as used.

(2) Parking.

- A. Unlawful Parking, Stopping. It is unlawful for the owner or operator of any vehicle, watercraft or other obstruction to leave or have left said vehicle, watercraft or other obstruction parked, stopped or standing, whether attended or unattended:
 - 1. So as to block, obstruct, or limit the use of any road, trail, parking lot, boat landing, waterway or winter sport facility, or:
 - 2. Outside of any area provided for such purposes when it is practical to use such areas, or
 - 3. Contrary to posted notice, or
 - 4. In any pPark area between the hours of 10:00 p.m. and the following 8:00 a.m. except that vehicle or watercraft owned by registered campers residing in adjacent campgrounds are permitted. Vehicles used to transport watercraft are permitted at designated boat landings at South Wood County Park, Dexter Park and Nepco Lake Park at any time. Attendees of events held within any of the enclosed shelter buildings may park in that area of the park until 12:00am.

Chapter 600 .07 FIRE AND FIREWORKS

(1) Fires.

- A. Unlawful Fires. It shall be unlawful for any person to start, tend, or maintain any fire, except at designated fireplaces, fire rings, or grills within any county Ppark, except that, fires for cooking or heating may be made in portable stoves, heaters, or grills at designated campgrounds and picnic areas.
- B. Unattended Fires. It shall be unlawful for any person to leave any fire unattended, or to throw away any matches, cigarettes, cigars, or pipe ashes or any embers without first extinguishing them, or to abandon any fire, or to start, tend, or use in any manner any fire contrary to posted notice in any County Park.
- C. Unlawful Firewood. It shall be unlawful for park users to bring outside firewood into any Wood County Pparks facility, shelter, land or area. Untreated, clean, and fully debarked dimensional lumber may be brought in for burning. Down and dead wood may also be gathered inside the park for burning. Chainsaws are not allowed to be used for this purpose. Wood County shall have firewood available, for purchase, at each of its designated campgrounds.

C.D. Refuse. It shall be unlawful to burn or place garbage or debris within fire rings. or fire places, within any County Park.

(2) Fireworks, Rockets, Explosive Devices. It shall be unlawful for any person to possess, fire, discharge, explode or set off any squib, cracker, or other explosive or

pyrotechnic device containing powder, or other combustible or explosive material, within the limits of any county prak, excepting that exhibitions of fireworks given under the direction or by the permission of the committee or its duly authorized agent are permitted.

Chapter 600 .08 ANIMALS

(1) Pets. It shall be unlawful for any person to allow pets to enter any public building, bathing beach, picnic grounds, or playgrounds within any Ccounty Ppark, or to run at large at any time on Ccounty Ppark grounds.

In other **C**county **P**park areas and campgrounds pets are permitted provided they shall at all times be kept on a leash not more than 10 feet long. All pets shall be effectively restrained or under the owner's control at all times. No person shall allow his pet to deprive or disrupt the enjoyment or use of any area by others. Pet owners are required to immediately clean up after their pets.

(2) Horses. It shall be unlawful for any person to ride a horse or have a horse in any Wood County Park without written authorization by by the Park Administrator Director or his authorized agent. Horses are allowed in the park a reas identified in §600.01(1) (b) between April 15 and Dec 1, unless posted otherwise.

- (3) Hunting and Trapping. It shall be unlawful for any person to take, catch, kill, hunt, trap, drive pursue or otherwise disturb any wild animals or birds in any ccounty park.
 - A. Park Exception. That part of Dexter County Park lying South of Highway 54, that part of Dexter County Park lying Nnorth of Park Road, South of Swallow Lane, and wwest of the Yellow River.
 - **B.** Area Exception. Hunting is allowed in the <u>park Aa</u>reas identified in §600.01 (1) (b) subject to postings.
 - B.C. Special Permit. Hunting and/or Trapping may be allowed in designated areas of the park by special permit with authorization from the committee.

Chapter 600 .09 ATHLETICS

- (1) Games or Sports in Undesignated Areas. It shall be unlawful for any person to play or practice ball, golf, tennis, archery, target shooting. paintball. airsoft. rope swings, other games or sports, upon or within any county practice approved locations such as: ball fields, tennis courts, archery ranges, gun ranges. or appropriate athletic grounds or golf links established and posted by the committee.
- (2) Skating. It shall be unlawful for any person to skate in any form or fashion including blade skating on roads in any part of the prark system in a reckless manner, or at a speed greater than is reasonable and proper, having regard to the number of people in such part

of the Park system and the use thereof, or so as to endanger life or limb, or the property of any person; provided, however, that nothing herein contained, shall be construed to prohibit any exhibition of or contests in fast or fancy skating on such portions of any ice pond as may be set aside and posted for that purpose by the Ccommittee.

Chapter 600 .10 BEACHES

(1) County Beaches. The following areas constitute public swimming beaches:

Nepco County Park Beach.
South Wood County Park, Red Beach.
South Wood County Park, White Beach.
North Wood County Park Beach.
Lake Dexter County Park Beach.

(2) Designation of Swimming Areas. The Wood County Park director Administrator shall determine what areas of public swimming beaches set forth in section 600.10 (1) shall be used for swimming and when. The Park Administrator department shall provide reasonable notice to the public in establishing swimming areas and times. Those parts of public swimming beaches used as swimming areas shall be marked with buoys which meet the standards set in Wisconsin Administrative Code NR 5.09, at any time the swimming areas are open for swimming.

(3) Food and Beverages. It shall be unlawful for any person to possess or consume any food or beverages of any kind on any bathing beach or in the water adjacent to any bathing beach in any County Ppark except in designated areas.

- (4) Boundary Buoys Altering or Damaging. It shall be unlawful to disturb, alter or damage a bathing beach boundary buoy or marker in any County Ppark.
- (5) Storms and Swimming Area Limits. It shall be unlawful for any person to:
 - A. swim, or wade in the water fronting any bathing beach during electrical storms or in dangerous weather, or
 - B. swim, or wade within 50 feet of any dam within the cCounty Ppark system, or
 - C. swim, or wade within 50 feet of any boat landing.
- (6) Beach Athletics. Except in locations designated for such purposes, it shall be unlawful for any person to engage in any athletic game or sport, or in any activity upon a swimming beach or in the water, when injury or inconvenience to others might result there from.
- (7) Swimming Apparel. It shall be unlawful for any swimmer to enter the water or onto any beach area, unless clothed in suitable swimming apparel. The object of this section is to prevent nudity.

- A. Changing Clothing. It shall be unlawful for any person to change clothes, except in a beach house or other enclosed place.
- B. Infectious Diseases. Any person having, or apparently having, any infectious disease shall be prohibited from entering onto any swimming beach or into any beach house or waters adjacent thereto.

Chapter 600 .11 CAMPING

- (1) Reservations. All designated campsites will be governed by a site reservation system and by self-registration when not reserved.
 - A. Campground & Self-Registration Policy. The Wood County Campground Reservations and Self-Registration Policy, including future amendments thereto is made a part of this ordinance.
- (2) Definitions. For the purposes of this Ordinance, the following definitions apply:
 - A. Camping or Camp. The use of a shelter such as a tent, trailer, motor vehicle, tarpaulin, bed roll or sleeping bag for temporary residence or sleeping purposes.
 - B. Camping Party. Any individual, family, individual group or minor group occupying a campsite.
 - C. Camping-Unit. A single shelter, except sleeping bags and hammocks, used for a camp by a camping party except those used exclusively for dining purposes.
 - **D.** Campsite. A segment of a campground which is designated for camping use by a camping unit or camping party.
 - 1. Wilderness Campsite. A campsite identified as such on county land.

 A camping permit is needed. Any camping outside of a Designated

 Campgrounds will require a Special Use Permit approved by the director, or his designee.

- E. Designated Campground. Any tract of land designated exclusively for camping.
- F. Enclosed Shelter. Any building or structure capable of being closed to public access, and which can be reserved for public or private group activities.
- G. Family. A parent or parents with their children and not more than two lineal relatives and not more than two minor guests.

H. Group Campground Area. A campground area designated for use by multiple camping groups. organizational or minor group.

- I. Individual Group. A camping party of not more than 6 persons occupying one camping unit.
- J. Minor Group. A group made up of minor members of an established organization and under the leadership of at least one competent, mature adult for each 10 minors in the group and using any number of camping units or occupying a gGroup eCampground Area.
- K. Open Shelter. Any building or structure with roof and open side walls, and which can be reserved for public or private group activities.
- (3) Camping Regulations.
 - A. Camping Prohibited. Camping is prohibited in the Wood County Parks except in Delesignated Ceampgrounds or by special permit.
 - B. Campground Occupancy LimitCamping Limited Designated Campgrounds. No person shall camp and no camping unit shall remain in a Ddesignated Ceampground for a period greater than 14 consecutive days from May 1 to October 31 (until November 30 in Dexter Park or the day following the end of the deer gun season in Dexter Park, the end of the deer gun season, whichever is earlier). Thereafter, the camping unit must be removed from the campgrounds for at least two days before being eligible to return. unless approved by the director, or his designee.
 - C. Campsite Occupancy. It shall be unlawful for more than one family or individual group to occupy more than a single campsite in a designated campground.
 - D. Campsite Changes. No registered Ceamping Party shall move from its assigned campsite to another campsite in a designated campground without prior approval from the designated park attendant.
 - E. Camping Permit Expiration. All camping permits must be renewed by 10:00 a.m. on the last day of the permit period. Campsites must be cleaned and vacated by 12:00 noon. Sunday check out time is 3:00 p.m., unless site is reserved for Sunday night.
 - F. Camping Entry Hours. No camping party shall start setting up or taking down its camping unit between the hours of 10:00 p.m. and the following 8:00 a.m., without authorization of the Park attendant, except in the case of an emergency.
 - G. Campsite Parking. It shall be unlawful to park any motor vehicle outside the

parking area designated at each campsite and not more than two motor vehicles are permitted to any campsite.

- H. Camping Permit Issuance.
 - 1. Underage 18Minimum Age. It shall be unlawful for any person under the age of 18 to obtain a camping permit.
 - 2. Not a Member of Camping Party. It shall be unlawful for any person to obtain a camping permit for use by a Ceamping Party of which he is not a member, except that parents or legal guardians and an adult leader of a minor group may obtain camping permits for use by Meminor Geroups.
- I. Campsite-Mandatory Occupancy. During the period from May 1 through Labor Day, a campsite must be occupied by a member of the Ceamping Pparty on the first night of the permit period and no campsite may be left unoccupied for more than 24 hours or the permit is forfeited.
- J. Camping Violations. Violations of any state law or any rules of the Highway Infrastructure and Recreation Wood County Park Committee or this or dinance by a member of a Ceamping Party is cause for revocation of the camping permit and/or other penalties as provided.
- **K.** Camping Prohibitions-Posted Notice. No person shall camp on any lands under the management, supervision or control of the Committee contrary to posted notice.

Chapter 600 .12 VIOLATION OF THIS ORDINANCE

(1) Legal Action.

- A. Arrest Powers. Any law enforcement officer of Wood County, or any of its municipal subdivisions, or law officers of the state, may issue a citation for the violation of any of the provisions of this chapter. Said citation shall be in the format set forth in Wis. Stats. §66.119, which is incorporated herein by reference. Said law enforcement officers as well as agents of the Parks & Forestry Department shall have, at all times, the right to enter the premises of any County Ppark, building, structure, or enclosure in any park, wayside, or special recreation area, including such grounds, buildings, structures, or enclosure which may be leased or set aside for private or exclusive use of any individual or group of individuals, for the purpose of determining that there is compliance with this Oordinance and the rules and regulations made by the Committee, and may use all necessary means to attain that end.
- B. <u>Prosecution.</u> Whenever an arrest shall have been made or any violation shall occur, the <u>Dd</u>istrict <u>Aa</u>ttorney or Corporation Counsel shall prosecute or proceed as provided by law.
- C. <u>Penalties</u>. Any person, firm company or corporation who violates the 600-14

regulations set forth in this $\underline{\circ}\Theta$ rdinance, or rules and regulations made by the

ceommittee, shall be subject to a forfeiture of not less than \$25 or more than \$500.00 together with the costs of the action. Each day a violation exists shall constitute a distinct and separate violation of this continue and as such, forfeitures shall apply accordingly.

(2) Notice of Violation

- A. Notice Issuance Authority. Wood County Parks and Forestry Department personnel, designated in writing by the Park Administrator director and peace officers described in 600.12 (1) A. shall have the authority to issue a "Notice of Violation" on forms approved by and pursuant to procedures established by the Park Administrator Director and the Wood County Park and Forestry Highway Infrastructure and Recreation Committee.
- B. Penalties. Persons to whom a "Notice of Violation" has been issued for violating this ordinance or rules and regulations made by the committee, may enter into a stipulation of guilt with Wood County by posting the sum (established in the fee schedule set by the Highway Infrastructure and Recreation Wood County Park and Forestry Committee), within 5 days after the issuance of a "Notice of Violation". Violators of this ordinance, who do not timely post said sum as a fee, shall be referred to Llaw enforcement for the issuance of a citation as provided in Section 600.12 (1) of the Ppark Oordinance.
- (3) **Damages.** In addition to the penalties specified in paragraph 600.12 (2), any person violating any of the provisions of this order chall be liable for any damages.

Chapter 600 .13 EFFECTIVE DATE AND REPEALS

- (1) Effective date. This $\underline{o}\Theta$ rdinance shall take effect and be in force from and after $\underline{itsit's'}$ passage and publication.
- (2) Repeals. All oordinances and parts of oordinances in conflict herewith, are repealed.
- (3) Invalidation. Invalidation of any one of the sub-sections of this Oordinance, by judgment or court order, shall in no way effect any of the other provisions thereof which shall remain in full force and effect.

Chapter 600 .14 SPECIAL EXCEPTIONS

(1) Special Exceptions - Special exception to the terms of this ordinance may be granted by prior approval of the <u>Highway Infrastructure and Recreation Park and Forestry</u> Committee_and/or the <u>Park Administrator Director</u>.

INTENT & SYNOPSIS: To allow the Parks and Forestry Department to retain all excess revenue, in years where the actual revenue exceeds the budgeted revenue.

FISCAL NOTE: These excess revenues would be placed into the Parks and Forestry Capital Projects account 245-2107-56913-000. This account will continue to be used for funding capital improvement projects, as well as equipment purchasing, and for covering operating expenses on years that revenues fall short of budget.

WHEREAS, due to several different factors, including market values and weather conditions, the Parks and Forestry Department's annual timber sale revenue has fluctuated between \$234,170.00 and \$639,801.00 over the past ten years, with the average being \$424,000.00, and

WHEREAS, this fluctuation makes it difficult to accurately budget these revenues; which are combined with all other parks and forestry revenues, and tax levy, to cover Parks and Forestry operating expenses, and

WHEREAS, the Parks and Forestry Department strives to follow through with its mission: To develop, maintain, and operate facilities, resources, and programs that meet the outdoor recreation, environmental, and economic needs of the public; and provide clean, safe, quality family enjoyment at a reasonable cost, and

WHEREAS, in order to follow through with this mission, the Parks and Forestry Department will need future Capital Improvement funds in order to purchase maintenance equipment, remodel aging facilities, replace outdated infrastructure, and develop new outdoor recreation areas, and

WHEREAS, continued funding of this Capital Projects account will allow the Parks and Forestry Department to follow through with its mission statement, while reducing the need for additional tax levy and/or borrowing,

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Wood County Board of Supervisors does hereby authorize the Parks and Forestry Department to retain all excess revenue, in years where the actual revenue exceeds the budgeted revenue, and to place those funds into the Parks and Forestry Capital Projects account.

WOOD COUNTY ORDINANCE #500 WOOD COUNTY FORESTRY ORDINANCE

500.1 AUTHORITY & PURPOSE

This ordinance is enacted to prescribe the rules and regulations for the establishment, protection, development, and management of the County Forest as provided in Chapters 26, 28, 29, 59, 75, and 77 of the Wisconsin Statutes, so as to provide a sustained yield of forest products for commercial use and the associated benefits of soil and water conservation, scenic value, recreational benefit, and fish and game resources, all in cooperation with the Department of Natural Resources.

500.2 DEFINITIONS

- (1) Agent. The Wood County Forest Administrator or designee.
- All-terrain vehicle. A commercially designed and manufactured motor-driven device that has a weight, without fluids, of 900 pounds or less, has a width of 50 inches or less, is equipped with a seat designed to be straddled by the operator and on three or more low-pressure or non-pneumatic tires. An ATV is an engine driven device which has a net weight of 900 pounds or less, which has a width of 48 inches or less, which is equipped with a seat designed to be straddled by the operator and which is designed to travel on 3 or more low pressure tires. A low-pressure tire is a tire which has a minimum width of 6 inches, which is designed to be mounted on a rim with a maximum diameter of 12 inches and which is designed to be inflated with an operating pressure not to exceed 6 pounds per square inch as recommended by the manufacturer.
- (3) <u>Beach</u>. Any water area or adjacent land area designated as a swim area by standard regulatory markers.
- (4) <u>Boat Landing</u>. Any site adjacent to water that provides public access to navigable waters.
- (5) <u>Board</u>. Wood County Board of Supervisors.
- (6) <u>Camp or Camping</u>. The use of a shelter such as a tent, trailer, Motor Vehicle, tarpaulin, bed roll or sleeping bag for temporary residence or sleeping purposes.
- (7) <u>Campsite</u>. A segment of a campground or Camping area which is designated for Camping use by a Camping unit or Camping Party.
- (8) <u>Camping Party</u>. Any individual, family, or individual group occupying a Campsite.
- (9) <u>Committee</u>. The <u>Wood County Highway Infrastructure and Recreation Committee</u> (HIRC) Wood County Park and Forestry Committee or its successor.

- (10) <u>County Land</u>. County Land or lands includes all lands acquired under supervision of the <u>HIRC Park and Forestry</u> Committee and those lands under land use agreement with it, including Federal, State, Town and Private lands that provide forest, wildlife or recreational benefit.
- (11) <u>County Forest Lands.</u> The Wood County Forest shall include all lands now held or hereafter acquired for forestry or special use purposes and entered under the provisions of Chapter 28.11 of the Wisconsin Statutes.
- (12) <u>County Reserved and Other County Lands.</u> Includes all lands administered under the jurisdiction of the Committee and not specified in 500.06 of this chapter.
- (13) **Department.** The Wood County Parks and Forestry Office.
- (14) <u>DNR.</u> The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources.
- (15) <u>Personnel</u>. Includes all individuals involved with the implementation of the Wood County Forest 15 Year Comprehensive Land Use Plan and under the direction of the <u>HIRC Park and Forestry Committee</u> <u>Committee</u> or the Forest Administrator.
- (16) <u>Picnic Area</u>. Any tract of land developed and maintained for picnicking including adjacent recreational areas.
- (17) <u>Plan</u>. The Wood County Forest 15 Year Comprehensive Land Use Plan and all other documents referenced therein.
- (18) <u>Motor Vehicle.</u> Any self–propelled device for moving persons or property or pulling implements from one place to another, excluding a self-propelled motorized wheelchair or similar device designed solely to aid the mobility of a physically disabled person.
- (19) <u>Snowmobile</u>. An engine-driven vehicle that is manufactured solely for snowmobiling that has an endless belt tread and sled-type runners or skis, to be used in contact with snow.

A snowmobile does **not** include a vehicle that is any of the following:

- (a) A Vehicle that has inflatable tires.
- (b) A Vehicle that is driven by a motor of 4 horsepower or less and that is operated in sanctioned races, derbies, competitions or exhibitions or only on private property.

A snowmobile cannot be over 48 inches wide if it was manufactured after May 7, 1994

500.3 COMMITTEE APPOINTMENT

The Wood County Board hereby assigns the administration of the County Forest and the Wood County State Wildlife Area to the Committee of this Board known as the Highway Infrastructure and Recreation (HIRC) Park and Forestry Committee.

500.4 POWERS AND DUTIES OF THE COMMITTEE

- (1) <u>Policies</u>. The Wood County Forest 15 year Comprehensive Land Use Plan and all documents referenced therein, shall serve as policy for the operation of the Department.
- (2) <u>Lands and Facilities</u>. Management and regulatory control of all lands and facilities designated in this chapter, or not specifically designated to another Committee of the Wood County Board of Supervisors, are delegated to the Committee.
- (3) <u>Scope</u>. The provisions of this Ordinance shall apply to all lands, structures and property owned, leased, controlled or administered by Wood County as determined in Sec. 500.06 (1) of this chapter. All such lands shall be shown on an official map or listing, at the <u>Parks</u> and Forestry Office located at the <u>Wood County River Block</u> <u>Building. Courthouse</u>, 111 W. Jackson Street, 400 Market Street, Wisconsin Rapids, Wisconsin and in accord with the records in the office of the Register of Deeds.
- (4) <u>County Forest Lands</u>. The Wood County Forest shall include all lands now held or hereafter acquired for forestry or special use purposes and entered under the provisions of Chapter 28.11 of the Wisconsin Statutes.
- (5) <u>County Reserved and Other County Lands</u>. Includes all lands administered under the jurisdiction of the Committee and not specified in 500.06 (1) of this chapter.
- (6) <u>Annual Operations</u>. The Committee shall prepare an annual work plan and budget for each ensuing year for the Department and its operations. The work plan and budget approved by the County Board shall establish the limits as well as purpose for which expenditures may be made.
- (7) <u>Personnel</u>. The Committee shall direct and supervise the County <u>Parks</u> and Forestry Office, subject to the approval of the County Board. It shall employ a County Forest Administrator as its Agent and such other competent Personnel as the Board may authorize to direct, perform, and enforce the administration and management functions of this chapter.
- (8) <u>Headquarters</u>. The Committee shall establish and maintain forest headquarters for office space and the housing of machinery, tools, equipment and supplies needed in conducting forestry operations.

- (9) <u>Equipment and Supplies</u>. The Committee may purchase, sell, trade, or dispose of equipment and supplies required for the operations of the Department within the limits contained in the annual budget.
- (10) <u>Land Acquisition</u>. The Committee may negotiate for the acquisition of lands and easements within the County Forest, <u>blocking</u>-boundary by purchase, gift, bequest, or by exchange of County owned lands outside the boundary for the purpose of blocking the forest for better administration or for recreational purposes. Any acquisition of lands must be presented to the County Board for its approval. Any lands proposed to be enrolled in the County Forest Law, or lands proposed to be withdrawn shall be subject to provisions contained in 28.11 Wis. Stats.
- (11) <u>Administration of County Forest Lands</u>. Applications for entry of County owned lands under 28.11 of Wisconsin Statutes, shall be prepared by the Wood County Forest Administrator, approved by the Committee, and signed by the County Board Chairman and the County Clerk. The County Forest Administrator will forward the applications to the DNR within the time limits prescribed by the DNR. Withdrawal of lands entered under the County Forest Law shall be in the manner prescribed by 28.11(11), Wisconsin Statutes. No deed to land so withdrawn shall be issued prior to recording the County Board Resolution and the DNR order of withdrawal with the Register of Deeds.
- (12) <u>Protection</u>. The Committee shall do all things reasonably necessary within the Department's budget for the protection of the forest, whether from fire, insects, disease, trespass or from damage by animals or from other causes, in cooperation with the Department of Natural Resources.
- (13) <u>Surveys</u>. The Committee shall direct activities of surveyors in locating survey lines and appropriately monumenting corners of County Forest Lands and reserved lands.
- (14) <u>Roads</u>. The Committee may construct, improve and maintain a system of forest roads, trails and firebreaks and purchase secure easements for access ways required to cross privately owned lands, within the parameters of the Plan and the Department's budget.
- (15) <u>Forest Improvements</u>. The Committee may conduct forest improvement work, including reforestation, release cuttings, thinnings, pruning, weeding, and any other approved silvicultural practice.
- (16) <u>Fish and Game</u>. The Committee shall work with the Department of Natural Resources on all matters relating to game and fish management.

- (17) <u>Sale of Forest Products</u>. The Committee may sell timber stumpage in accordance with the guidelines in the 15 Year Comprehensive Land Use Plan.
- (18) <u>Cooperation</u>. The Committee may enter agreements with the U.S. Forest Service, Lake States Forest Experiment Station, the University of Wisconsin and the Department of Natural Resources for the use of County Lands, labor, materials and equipment for conducting forest research.
- (19) <u>Special Uses</u>. The Committee may establish, construct and maintain recreation and interpretation facilities, Boat Landings, wild resource zones, aesthetic, management zones, special use areas and wildlife habitat.
- (20) <u>Prospecting</u>. The Committee may enter into agreements to mine for minerals and other natural resources upon County Lands under the Department's jurisdiction, subject to the approval by the Board and the Department of Natural Resources.
- (21) <u>Use Permits</u>. The Committee may authorize special uses of County Land by written permit. Any such permit shall be revocable for cause by written notice. The Committee may establish and charge fees for special use permits.
- (22) <u>Sand and Gravel Permits</u>. The Committee may issue permits to municipalities within Wood County for removal of sand and gravel from County Land under the Department's jurisdiction, consistent with Chapter 28.11, Wisconsin State Statutes.
- (23) <u>Plan</u>. The Committee shall cooperate with the Department of Natural Resources in the establishment and maintenance of the Wood County 15 Year Comprehensive Land Use Plan. In addition, the Wood County Forest Administrator will participate in the determination of the allowable annual cut, an inventory of growing stock and increment acreage control, establishment of compartments and other necessary items for such Plan.
- (24) <u>Special Recreation Area</u>. The Committee may create and update rules and regulations for the use of the <u>shooting ranges</u>. <u>Rifle Pistol Range</u>, <u>Marshfield Pond-Area</u>, ATV Area, <u>disabled hunter blinds and surrounding areas</u>, and any other special recreation areas.
- (25) <u>Additional Rules</u>. Rules and regulations may be made from time to time, by the Committee, governing the further use and enjoyment of property administered by the Committee. Any person who shall violate such rules or regulations, or who refuses to subject himself thereto, may be excluded from the use of such facility and be subject to penalties.

500.5 FOREST FINANCES

- (1) <u>County Forest Land Fund</u>. If in the event that County Forest Land is sold or traded, all proceeds from the sale or trade of the Lands, entered under Chapter 28.11 of the Wisconsin Statutes, shall be credited to a non-lapsing account entitled the County Forest Land Fund. These funds are to be used for the purchase of property to be added to the County Forest.
- (2) <u>Town and State Severance Accounts</u>. Ten percent of the gross timber sale revenue shall be deposited in a segregated non-lapsing account to be paid proportionally to the towns containing County Forest Lands, as per Wisconsin Statue 28.11 (9) (d). In addition, 20% of the gross timber sale revenue shall be deposited in a segregated non-lapsing account to be paid to the Department of Natural Resources when there is an outstanding debt, as per Wisconsin Statute 28.11 (9) (a).
- (3) <u>General Fund</u>. All monies received from the sale of timber stumpage, cut forest products, fees and use permits, sale of building materials, sale of surplus materials and equipment, fire or other damage collections or revenues received by the <u>Park and Forestry</u> Committee will be deposited in the General Fund at the end of the year unless otherwise specified under 500.05 of this chapter.
- (4) <u>State Funds</u>. All allotments from state funds under s.28.11 (8)(b) State Forest Aid Fund, s.86.315 Road Aids, s. 23.09 (17) (m) Habitat Development Grant, s.23.09 (12) County Fish and Game Fund, s.23.09 (26) Snowmobile Aids, and s. 23.09 (25) Motorcycle Aids Program, of the Wisconsin Statutes, shall be deposited in their respective funds and shall be non-lapsing.
- (5) <u>Bond Deposit Account</u>. All deposits for timber sale bid bonds and performance bonds shall be deposited in the Bond Deposit Fund and such fund shall be non-lapsing.

500.6 FOREST LAND USE REGULATIONS

(1) <u>Designation of Forest Lands</u>. All County Lands and facilities thereon owned, leased, controlled, or operated by the Committee, and not designated under Ch. 27 Wisconsin Statutes, except Dexter Park, shall be considered forest lands and regulated by this chapter.

(2) Forest Products Harvest and Theft.

A. <u>Timber Cutting</u>. Commercial cutting, salvage cuttings and cultural cuttings on lands designated in this chapter, shall be by written permit or contract, approved by the Committee.

- B. <u>Firewood and Special Products</u>. Commercial harvest of firewood and specialty products shall be by contract or written permit by the Wood County Forest Administrator or designee(s).
- C. <u>Product Theft</u>. No person shall remove any plant, tree, parts of a tree or other forest products from any County Lands designated in this chapter except as authorized by the Committee or its Agent by written permit, contract or policy. Picking fruit, berries, nuts and mushrooms is permitted, unless determined otherwise by the Forest Administrator.

(3) County Property Destruction and Entry.

- A. <u>Destruction</u>. No person shall disturb, vandalize, damage, deface, remove or destroy any trees, shrubs, plants, other natural growth, sand or gravel; carve on any rocks, archaeological or geological features, signs, walls, tables or structures; drive nails into trees; or remove injure or deface in any manner any structures including buildings, signs, gates, fences, tables or other County property. The picking of edible fruits, berries, nuts and mushrooms is permitted.
- **B.** Entry. No person shall enter or be in any building, installation, area, or trail that may be locked or closed to public use or contrary to public or posted notice without a written permit from the Forest Administrator.
- C. <u>Tampering</u>. No person shall tamper with any building, installation, or area which may be under construction, locked or closed to public use, and/or tamper with, use, or damage any water control structure, device, dam, or culvert, or act contrary to posted or public notice.
- **D.** <u>Damage by Vehicle</u>. No person shall, and no owner shall allow, the operation of a vehicle for recreational use or other purpose in or on any property administered by the Committee in such a manner as to cause soil erosion, pollution or other damage.

(4) Sporting and Recreational Use of Forest Lands.

- A. <u>Recreation Use Permits</u>. Written permits, approved by the Committee, and issued by its Agent, to organizations are required for recreational use of specified areas of County Lands, including ski clubs, Snowmobile clubs, and other organizations and organized horse trail rides. Permits may be issued for up to one year.
- B. Abandoned Vehicles. As used in this section, vehicle means any Motor

Vehicle, trailer, semi-trailer, or mobile home. No person shall leave, nor shall any owner allow any vehicle to be left unattended, without prior authority from the Forest Administrator, under such circumstances as to cause the vehicle to reasonably appear to have been abandoned. An abandoned vehicle shall constitute a public nuisance and be subject to removal at the owner's expense. Removal of the vehicle shall not relieve the owner or the operator of the vehicle from any penalty incurred because of such violation.

- C. <u>Camping</u>. Camping is permitted on County Forest Lands not designated as formal recreational areas, excluding those areas adjacent to existing County park <u>Camping facilities</u> and areas posted as <u>Nno Camping aAllowed</u>. Camping in excess of 14 consecutive days is not permitted without a permit from the Forest Administrator.
- **D.** Elevated blinds. No person shall construct, maintain, occupy, or use on County Land any elevated scaffold or other elevated device, except that portable stands may be used provided they are completely removed each day at the close of hunting hours and provided such devices do no damage to any tree, or to other County property.
- **E.** <u>Ground Blinds</u>. No person may construct, occupy, or use on County Land any ground blind unless the following conditions are met:
 - 1. The blind shall be constructed only of natural materials found lying dead and down in the immediate area, and cause no damage to trees or other County property. Portable ground blinds may be used provided they are completely removed each day at the close of hunting hours.
 - 2. The total area enclosed shall be no more than 36 square feet.
 - **3.** The blind is to be constructed so as it will not interfere with the movement of authorized vehicles or equipment and constructed in such a manner that it blends in with the surrounding area.
 - 4. All objects that are not in a form found naturally within the immediate area shall be removed from the blind each day at the close of hunting hours.

F. Vehicular Traffic.

- 1. No person shall operate any vehicle at a speed, or in a manner contrary to official traffic signs on County Lands.
- 2. No person shall operate a Motor Vehicle in an abusive, boisterous,

unreasonably loud or otherwise disorderly manner under circumstances which tend to cause a disturbance. Such conduct shall include, but not be limited to: conduct which tends to disturb, annoy or endanger one or more persons because of unnecessary or deliberate spinning of wheels, squealing of tires, revving of engine, blowing the horn, causing the engine to backfire, or causing the vehicle while commencing to move or in motion to raise one or more of its wheels, tracks or skis off the ground, or operate at an unreasonable or imprudent speed on any County Lands.

3. No person shall, and no owner shall allow, operation of any Motor Vehicle on any County Forest Lands, or on any Secondary Forest Road as identified in the Wood County Forest 15-Year Comprehensive Land Use Plan, or on any forest road or trail closed by a gate, soil berm, boulders, barricade, or other device designed to block vehicular access to such area or road, or posted as closed, unless such party is authorized by permit or contract issued pursuant to this chapter. Limited off-road use of motor vehicles may be permitted for holders of valid firewood cutting permits within designated firewood cutting areas. The Committee or its Agent may authorize special Motor Vehicle use areas or trails and establish rules and regulations for use thereof by the general public. The Committee or its Agent may authorize by Disabled Access Permit, persons with physical disabilities to use a designated Motor Vehicle as a mode of personal conveyance. Disabled access permits may only be issued to those persons eligible to receive, and able to present a Wisconsin disabled hunter permit, or other similar acceptable proof of disability. A permit is not required for disabled persons using a motorized wheelchair. Agents of the County doing official business are exempted from this rule.

G. Parking.

- No person shall, and no owner shall allow parking, stopping, or leave standing, whether attended or unattended any vehicle, watercraft, or obstruction:
 - a. In any manner as to block, obstruct, or limit the use of any road, trail, parking lot, Boat Landing, waterway, or recreational facility.
 - **b.** Outside of any area provided for such purposes when it is practical to use such areas.
 - c. Contrary to posted notice.
- 2. No person shall, and no owner shall allow parking, stopping, or leave standing, whether attended or unattended, any vehicle in areas reserved, by official traffic signs indicating the restriction, for vehicles

displaying registration plates or identification cards which designate the vehicle as a vehicle used by a physically disabled person as defined in s.346.505 Wis. Statutes, unless said vehicle has properly displayed said registration.

- **3.** Agents of the County doing official business are exempted from this rule.
- **H.** Snowmobiles. No person shall, and no owner shall allow operation or parking of any Snowmobile on any blocked road, trail or designated ski trail. Agents of the County doing official business are exempted from this rule.
- I. Marshfield Pond Area Fishing. No person shall remove any Large Mouth or Small Mouth Bass from the Marshfield Pond Area Pond. When a Large Mouth or Small Mouth Bass is caught from this pond, it is to be immediately returned into the pond in a manner causing the least damage to the fish.
- J. <u>Special Use Areas</u>. In addition to rules and regulations set forth in this ordinance, rules and regulations of the <u>Parks</u> Ordinance will also apply to the ATV area, <u>shooting ranges</u>, <u>rifle range</u> and other developed recreation areas.
- (5) <u>Special Use</u>. Special use of specific areas of County Lands shall be authorized only by written permit issued by the Committee.
- (6) <u>Refuse</u>. No person shall leave or dump any litter, rubbish, debris, dirt, stone or other materials on any County Lands. When garbage receptacles are provided by the County only garbage generated on the site, and associated with the special activity for which purpose the receptacle was provided, may be placed in the receptacle. No personal or private garbage or materials may be deposited in the receptacles.
- (7) <u>Fires</u>. No person shall burn trash, slash or litter on County Land except as authorized by written permit or policy, or specific authorization of the Forest Administrator.
- (8) <u>Prospecting</u>. No person shall prospect on County Land without written permit issued by the Committee.
- (9) Access. No person shall block or restrict access to any trail, road, parking area, recreational facility, or intentionally interfere with the use of lands and facilities under the management and regulatory control of the Committee. Agents of the County doing official business are exempted from this rule.
- (10) Public Meetings and Sales. Any person desiring to hold a public meeting of any

kind whatsoever, on any property administered by the Committee, shall first obtain a permit from the Committee or its duly authorized Agent. The permit must be applied for not less than 48 hours prior to the scheduled event.

- (11) <u>Peddling and Soliciting</u>. It is unlawful for any person to peddle or solicit business of any nature, to distribute handbills or other advertising matter, or to post signs, posters, or decorations on any lands or structures under the jurisdiction of the Committee, for any purpose whatsoever, unless first authorized by the Committee or its duly authorized Agent in writing.
- (12) <u>Signs</u>. It is unlawful for any person to place unauthorized signs on any property administered by the Committee.
- (13) <u>Survey Monuments</u>. No person shall remove, cover, bury, destroy or deface any survey monument, corner post, monument accessory, witness tree, bearing tree, or survey accessory on any lands within Wood County, without following applicable statutory provisions.
- (14) <u>Installation. Public Utilities</u>, and <u>Private Construction</u>. The location of all public and private utilities, structures, lines, and pipes within any property administered by the Committee shall be subject to the control of the Committee and their construction, erection, repair, or relocation shall be undertaken only after written consent thereto is received from the Committee or its Agent.
- (15) <u>Personal Conduct</u>. It is unlawful for any person to engage in violent, abusive, indecent, profane, boisterous, unreasonably loud, or otherwise disorderly conduct under circumstances in which such conduct tends to cause or provoke a disturbance on any property administered by the Committee.
- (16) <u>Property of Others</u>. It is unlawful for any person to disturb, destroy, vandalize, damage, or remove the property or personal effects of others on any property administered by the Committee. Personal effects left on property administered by the Committee may be removed by the Agent of the County.

500.7 VIOLATION OF THIS ORDINANCE

(1) Legal Action

A. <u>Arrest Powers</u>. Any law enforcement officer of Wood County or any of its municipal subdivisions, or law officers of the state, may issue a citation for the violation of any of the provisions of this chapter. Said citation shall be in the format set forth in Wis. Stats. S66.0113, which is incorporated herein by reference. Said law enforcement officers as well as Agents of the Parks & Forestry

Department shall have at all times the right to enter the premises of any County Land, building, structure, or enclosure in any park, wayside, or special recreation area, including such grounds, buildings, structures, or enclosures which may be leased or set aside for private or exclusive use of any individual or group of individuals, for the purpose of determining that there is compliance with this Ordinance and the rules and regulations made by the Committee, and may use all necessary means to attain that end.

- **B.** <u>Prosecution</u>. Whenever an arrest shall have been made or any violation shall occur, the District Attorney or Corporation Counsel shall prosecute or proceed as provided by law.
- **C.** Penalties. Any person, firm, company, or corporation who violates the regulations set forth in this Ordinance, or rules and regulations made by the Committee, shall be subject to a forfeiture of not less than \$25 or more than \$500, together with the costs of the action. Each day a violation exists shall constitute a distinct and separate violation of this Ordinance and as such, forfeitures shall apply accordingly.

(2) Notice of Violation

- A. <u>Notice Issuance Authority</u>. Wood County Parks & Forestry Department Ppersonnel, designated in writing by the Forest Administrator, and peace officers described in 500.07 (1) A. shall have the authority to issue a "Notice of Violation" on forms approved by and pursuant to procedures established by the Forest Administrator and the Committee.
- **B.** Penalties. Persons to whom a Notice of Violation has been issued for violating this Ordinance or rules and regulations made by the Committee may enter into a stipulation of guilt with Wood County by posting the sum (established in the fee schedule set by the Committee), within 5 days after the issuance of a Notice of Violation. Violators of this ordinance who do not timely post said sum as a fee shall be referred to Law Enforcement for the issuance of a citation as provided in Section 500.07 (1) of the Forestry Ordinance.
- (3) <u>Ejection From County Forest.</u> Any person who has violated the terms of this Ordinance may be subject to the immediate ejection from the County Land by the Wood County Forest Administrator or his designee(s), Wood County Sheriff's deputy or Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources law enforcement Personnel. Any person ejected from County Land may not reenter any County Land for a minimum of 24 hours.
- (4) <u>Seizure</u>. Whenever forest products are found to have been unlawfully severed from County Lands, the sheriff shall, on satisfactory evidence, seize such materials pursuant to Section 26.06 of the Wisconsin Statutes for use by the County or for sale, as the

Committee may determine.

(5) <u>Damages</u>.

- A. In addition to the penalties specified in paragraph 500.07 (2), any person violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be liable for any damages.
- **B.** Whenever evidence of unlawful cutting on County Lands is filed with the Corporation Counsel, he\she may, and on direction of the Committee shall, bring suit to recover damages as provided by Section 26.09, Wisconsin Statutes. Similarly, civil suit may be brought against parties responsible for forest fire damage under Section 26.21, Wisconsin Statutes.

500.8 SPECIAL EXCEPTIONS, EFFECTIVE DATE, AND REPEALS

- (1) <u>Special Exceptions</u>. Special exceptions to this ordinance may be granted by prior written approval of the Committee and Forest Administrator.
- (2) <u>Effective Date</u>. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication as required by law.
- (3) <u>Repeals</u>. All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.
- (4) <u>Invalidation</u>. Invalidation of any one of the subsections of this Ordinance by judgment or court order shall in no way affect any of the other provisions thereof, which shall remain in full force and effect.

WHEREAS, ATV users sometimes must cross a bridge or culvert on a roadway that is officially closed to all-terrain vehicle or utility terrain vehicle traffic, and

WHEREAS, the bridges and culverts are not part of the national system of interstate and defense highways, and

WHEREAS, the bridges and culverts are 1,000 feet in length or less, and

WHEREAS, the bridges and culverts are located within the territorial boundaries of the County.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE WOOD COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS HEREBY ORDAINS, that Wood County Ordinance 403 is established to read as follows:

WOOD COUNTY ORDINANCE # 403 Highway Access by ATV and UTV Operators

403.01 Purpose. This ordinance is intended to regulate the use of ATVs and UTVs in crossing county highways.

- a. ATV means an all-terrain vehicle as that is defined in Wis. Stat. Ch. 340.01(2g).
- b. UTV means a utility terrain vehicle.
- c. Highway means a Wood County Highway.
- 403.03 Regulations. An ATV or UTV user crossing a bridge or culvert on a highway must do all of the following:
 - a. Cross the bridge in the most direct manner practicable and at a place where no obstruction prevents a quick and safe crossing.
 - Stay as far to the right of the roadway or shoulder as practicable.
 - Stop the vehicle prior to the crossing.
 - d. Yield the right-of-way to other vehicles, pedestrians, and electric personal assistive mobility devices using the roadway or shoulder.

e. Exit the highway as quickly and safely as practicable after crossing the bridge.

403.04 Penalties. Any person violating any provision of this ordinance may be required to forfeit not less than \$20.00 nor more than \$200.00 plus costs.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication as required by law.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, upon adoption of this ordinance, the County Clerk shall immediately send a copy of the ordinance to the Wisconsin Department of Transportation, to the State Traffic Patrol, and to the office of any law enforcement agency having jurisdiction over any of the highways to which the ordinance applies.
