### **NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING**

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that a Public Hearing will be conducted by the Conservation, Education and Economic Development Committee (CEED) of the Wood County Board of Supervisors on Tuesday, August 20, 2019, beginning at 8:00 a.m. in Room 114 of the Wood County Courthouse (400 Market Street, Wisconsin Rapids, WI 54495) to consider a proposed boundary amendment to the Sewer Service Area Map of the Wisconsin Rapids Sewer Service Area/Water Quality Management Plan – 2030.

The purpose of the Public Hearing is to accept public testimony on the proposed Sewer Service Area (SSA) boundary amendment.

The primary reason for the boundary amendment is to add the proposed South Wood County Airport Hangar Building to the SSA so sanitary sewer can be extended to the structure. Additionally, the existing Airport Terminal Building is proposed to be added to the SSA. In total, the proposed boundary amendment would add 3.74 acres to the SSA and remove an area of equal size.

Upon the close of the Public Hearing, a meeting of the Conservation, Education and Economic Development Committee (CEED) will convene to take action on the proposal.
