Sealed bids will be received under the procedures of § 28.11 (6)(b) of Wisconsin Statutes, until 4:00 P.M., June 6, 2017 at the Wood County River Block Building, Parks and Forestry Department Office, 2<sup>nd</sup> floor, Room 202, 111 W. Jackson Street, Wisconsin Rapids, WI 54495 or hand delivered until 8:15 A.M., June 7, 2017 at the Parks and Forestry Office. Late bids will not be accepted. Specific information on sales, maps of the cutting areas, bid forms, cutting requirements, contract specifications, forestry policies and public participation may be obtained by contacting the Wood County Parks and Forestry Department at the Wood County River Block Building at 111 W. Jackson Street, Wisconsin Rapids, or by calling (715) 421-8422. After all information and comments on the sales are considered, the bids will be opened in the Parks & Forestry Office at the Wood County River Block building, 2<sup>nd</sup> floor, Room 202 at 8:30 AM on June 7, 2017.

\*PLEASE NOTE: BIDDERS MAY OPERATE ATV'S ON THE COUNTY FOREST FOR THE PURPOSE OF VIEWING TIMBER SALES.

The total acreage for sale is 304 acres with the following volumes represented (by species and product):

### **PULPWOOD (Tons):**

Oak = 2475; Mixed Hardwood = 3605; Aspen = 2675; White Pine = 1120; Jack/Red Pine = 200

### **SAW TIMBER (MBF):**

White Oak Saw Logs = 12; Red Maple Saw Logs = 35; Red Oak Saw Logs = 45; Oak Saw Logs = 125;

Volumes listed above are based on standard utilization.

**Biomass:** Biomass harvest and utilization may be possible on most tracts. Those interested in biomass harvest should contact the Wood County Forest Administrator to discuss specifics of biomass harvest in relation to each particular sale. Bids will be evaluated on the value of estimated pulpwood and saw timber products.

Bids shall be filled out on bid forms provided and include a deposit of 20% for each tract. Bids that are not filled out completely, or are incorrect, may be subject to rejection.

All bids must be in sealed envelopes plainly marked "<u>Timber Sale Bid</u>" with <u>Bidders Name</u>. Contractors desiring to bid on more than one tract must submit separate bids and deposits on each tract. Please note appropriate tract number on each bid envelope.

Deposits for successful bids will not be returned until the provisions of the contract are fulfilled.

Utilization is required to the minimum specifications of merchantability of each species. Purchasers <u>MUST</u> provide the Forest Administrator with a certificate of insurance indicating that worker's compensation insurance coverage is provided <u>before contracts are issued</u>. Any claims of exemptions must be in compliance with State Statutes and proven in writing prior to bid. Wood County must be named as "Additionally Insured" on insurance certificates. <u>NO EXCEPTIONS WILL BE MADE</u> unless specifically stated on the sale map.

Timber sale prospectus may be obtained from the Wood County Parks and Forestry Department upon request.

The Highway Infrastructure and Recreation Committee reserves the right to accept or reject any or all bids when in the best interest of Wood County.

Contractors wishing to use an Irrevocable Letter of Credit may do so as long as the following criteria are met. It is recommended that this criteria be given to the lending institution prior to that institution attempting to draft the Irrevocable Letter of Credit. This will insure that your bid will not be rejected due to an unacceptable Irrevocable Letter of Credit.

### IRREVOCABLE LETTER OF CREDIT

Contents of an irrevocable letter of credit must include the following:

- A. Must be made in favor of Wood County Parks and Forestry Department.
- B. Letter-of-Credit number.
- C. A clear statement that it is irrevocable.
- D. Name of the bank's customer; that is the principal.
- E. Amount of credit extended (maximum limit). This limit must equal or exceed the penal sum or penalty for which the letter of credit is pledged to secure.
- F. Must cover the performance of all terms and conditions of the agreement (contract) in addition to stumpage payments.
- G. Must be negotiable for <u>6 months beyond the contract length</u> or until released by the County Forest Administrator.
- H. An authorization to draw sight drafts upon the bank in favor of Wood County Parks and Forestry Department.
- I. Must state in clear text how drafts are to be made for any default in performance of the contract.
- J. If partial collection is made on the irrevocable letter of credit, the balance will remain negotiable until the expiration of the letter.

### FOREST CERTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS

Contractors must provide proof that they are SFI certified.

### MILL SCALE TICKET SYSTEM

The Mill Scale Ticket system may be used if approved by the Forest Administrator in advance. All other wood will be scaled at the cutting site. Wood County no longer requires advanced payment for tickets for Contractors in good standing. Further explanation of the requirements of the ticket system may be received by contacting the Forest Administrator.

### **UTILIZATION SPECIFICATIONS**

The following standards apply for utilization:

Aspen Pulpwood	5" top diameter inside bark
Hardwood Pulpwood	5" top diameter inside bark
Pine Pulpwood	4" top diameter inside bark
Hardwood Sawlogs	10" top diameter inside bark
Pine Sawlogs	9" top diameter inside bark

All wood that meets the minimum top diameters at 8'6" will be scaled as a sawlog regardless of the log length and top diameter.

Merchantable trees are those that have one or more 100-inch pulpwood sticks with a minimum top diameter of five inches (4" for pine).

Peeled Aspen will be billed at an additional 12.5%.

Conversion factors if used are as follows: Hardwoods 2.2 cords/thousand and Softwoods at 2.44 cords/thousand

Conversion factors for weight scaled wood are as according to the DNR Timber Sale Handbook (current year).





### MINIMUM ACCEPTABLE BID: \$26,865.00

SALE OBJECTIVES: Sale objective is to release the next stand of oak and white pine by harvesting overstory trees while protecting established regeneration as much as possible. Seed trees will be left in varying densities dependent on the degree of advance regeneration.

<u>CUTTING AREA DESCRIPTION:</u> The two timber sale cutting units are bounded by red paint lines on all sides except along the snowmobile trail at the north end of each unit. The harvest area consists of mature stands of red, white, and black oak mixed with scattered white pine, aspen, and red maple.

### **CUTTING REQUIREMENTS/SPECIFICATIONS:**

• Cutting Unit A - east cutting unit (13 acres):

Cut all merchantable oak, mixed hardwoods, white pine, and aspen except, do not cut any tree marked with green paint. No shearing is required.

Cutting Units B - west cutting unit (14 acres):

Cut all merchantable oak, aspen, and mixed hardwoods. Do not cut any white pine and any other tree marked with green paint. No shearing is required.

- Take precautions to protect advance oak and pine regeneration, especially sapling regeneration.
- Cut designated trees with one or more 100" sticks (pulp) or with one or more 8'6" sawlogs. Sawlog minimum top diameter is 10" inside bark for an 8'6" sawlog. The standard utilization is 5" minimum top diameter for aspen, oak, and mixed hardwood pulpwood, and to a 4" minimum top diameter for pine pulpwood.
- All species and products must be cut concurrently when harvesting the timber. Logs and bolts may require scaling in the field. Bolts
  destined to a mill that buys on weight may be allowed to go on tickets.
- All standing dead trees shall be left for wildlife values.
- Biomass harvest may be allowed on this sale, however; bids will be evaluated based on traditional forest products and volumes listed
  above. Contractors interested in biomass harvest should contact the forest administrator.

ACCESS: Access to the sale is from the snowmobile trail coming west off of Hemlock Rd. Landing sites are noted on the map. Landing wood along the snowmobile trail may be permitted if it can done safely and not impact the use of the trail. No additional road building is needed.

### RESTRICTIONS:

- The county may restrict the type of equipment used on the job if conditions or damage warrant.
- Seasonal Restrictions: Harvesting is not allowed from April 1 through July 15 due to oak wilt concerns. Outside of those dates, logging chance is dependent on ground and weather conditions. Soils are seasonally wet in places, especially along the snowmobile trail between the two cutting units and in portions of the western cutting unit.



### MINIMUM ACCEPTABLE BID: \$36,915.00

<u>SALE OBJECTIVES</u>: The general sale objective is to release the next stand of oak and white pine by harvesting overstory trees while protecting established regeneration as much as possible. Seed trees will be left in varying densities dependent on the degree of advance regeneration.

<u>CUTTING AREA DESCRIPTION</u>: There are six patches to harvest with three cutting prescriptions. Red and blue paint lines mark the boundaries of all cutting units. The harvest area consists of mature stands of red, white, and black oak mixed with scattered white pine, aspen, and red maple.

### **CUTTING REQUIREMENTS/SPECIFICATIONS:**

• Cutting Unit A - east cutting unit (12 acres):

This unit lies adjacent to private lands to the cast of the county forest. Cut all merchantable aspen and mixed hardwoods. Cut only those oak marked with orange paint and, cut all ironwood 2<sup>11</sup> in diameter or larger. Do not cut any white pine and any other tree marked with green paint. Other than ironwood, no shearing is required.

• Cutting Units B - cutting units along Boyer Rd. (6 acres):

Cut all merchantable oak, aspen, and mixed hardwoods. Do not cut any white pine, and any other tree marked with green paint. Shearing is required of all aspen and mixed hardwood >211 in diameter.

• Cutting Units C - units located south of Boyer Rd. (38 acres)

Cut all merchantable black and red oak, aspen, and mixed hardwoods. Do not cut any white pine, white oak, and any other tree marked with green paint. No shearing is required.

• Take precautions to protect advance oak and pine regeneration, especially sapling regeneration.

- Cut designated trees with one or more 100" sticks (pulp) or with one or more 8'6" sawlogs. Sawlog minimum top diameter is 10" inside bark for an 8'6" sawlog. The standard utilization is 5" minimum top diameter for aspen, oak, and mixed hardwood pulpwood.
- All species and products must be cut concurrently when harvesting the timber. Logs and bolts may require scaling in the field. Bolts destined to a mill that buys on weight may be allowed to go on tickets.

All standing dead trees shall be left for wildlife values.

• Biomass harvest may be allowed on this sale, however; bids will be evaluated based on traditional forest products and volumes listed above. Contractors interested in biomass harvest should contact the forest administrator.

ACCESS: Access to the sale is from Boyer Road and forest roads coming south from Boyer Rd. The contractor will need to freeze a marsh road to access the two southern-most cutting units. Landing sites must be approved by the forest administrator.

### RESTRICTIONS:

- The county may restrict the type of equipment used on the job if conditions or damage warrant.
- Seasonal Restrictions: Harvesting is not allowed from April 1 through July 15 due to oak wilt concerns, Outside of those dates, logging chance is dependent on ground and weather conditions. This is likely a winter only sale for a majority of the harvest acreage.



### MINIMUM ACCEPTABLE BID: \$34,494.00

SALE OBJECTIVES: The sale objective is to regenerate aspen and maple using coppice and overstory removal harvest systems, while maintaining mature oak and pine for wildlife values and aesthetics.

<u>CUTTING AREA DESCRIPTION:</u> The timber sale area consists of aspen and red maple with scattered oak and patches of pine. Red maple saplings are well established in the understory over most of the sale area. The sale is broken into two cutting units which are separated from each other with a double red paint line (see map). A red paint line bounds the sale area on all sides except along Range Rd.

### **CUTTING REQUIREMENTS/SPECIFICATIONS:**

• Cutting Unit A - Aspen Clearcut (no shearing required - 35 acres):

Cut all merchantable aspen, mixed hardwood, black oak, and jack pine. Cut only those red pine marked with orange paint. Do not cut any white pine or any oak marked with green paint. No shearing is required.

• Cutting Unit B - Aspen Clearcut (shearing required - 60 acres):

Cut all merchantable aspen, mixed hardwood, black oak, and jack pine. Cut only those red pine marked with orange paint, except cut all merchantable red pine south of the access trail (see map). Do not cut any white pine or any oak marked with green paint. Shearing of all stems other than pine, 2" in diameter or larger is required.

- Cut designated trees with one or more 100" sticks The standard utilization is 5" minimum top diameter for aspen, oak, and mixed hardwood pulpwood, and to a 4" minimum top diameter for pine pulpwood.
- All species and products must be cut concurrently when harvesting the timber. Logs and bolts may require scaling in the field. Bolts destined to a mill that buys on weight may be allowed to go on tickets.
- · All standing dead trees shall be left for wildlife values.
- Biomass harvest may be allowed on this sale, however; bids will be evaluated based on traditional forest products and volumes listed above. Contractors interested in biomass harvest should contact the forest administrator.

ACCESS: Access to the sale is from several woods trails coming off of Range Rd. These access trails are bermed and the contractor will need to open the roads prior to harvest. Some additional road work may be needed to improve the access trails for use. Landing sites may be located along these access trails.

### RESTRICTIONS:

- The county may restrict the type of equipment used on the job if conditions or damage warrant.
- Seasonal Restrictions: No harvesting is allowed from April 1 through July 15 due to oak wilt concerns. Outside of these dates, harvesting is dependent on ground and weather conditions. Soils are seasonally wet over most of the sale area.



### MINIMUM ACCEPTABLE BID: \$24,290.00

<u>SALE OBJECTIVES:</u> The harvest area consists of white pine plantations. The objective of the harvest is to thin the pine stands on 30 acres to improve future timber quality and to release white pine regeneration with an overstory removal harvest on 12 acres.

<u>CUTTING AREA DESCRIPTION</u>: The sale boundary is marked with red paint lines. There is also a red paint line between the Thinning Unit and the Overstory Removal Unit. In addition, there are no-cut areas with scattered large white pines and dense white pine saplings designated with a double red paint line facing into the Thinning Unit. Other more open wetlands do not have paint lines around them and are shown on the sale map. These white pine stands have been thinned once previously. In the overstory removal harvests, cut trees average 14" dbh and 6 to 7 pulpsticks. In the thinning areas, cut trees average 8-10" dbh and 4 to 6 pulpsticks.

### **CUTTING REQUIREMENTS/SPECIFICATIONS:**

- Thinning Unit (30 acres): Cut all merchantable aspen and mixed hardwoods; cut only those white pine, red pine, and oak marked with orange paint.
- Overstory Removal Unit (12 acres): Cut all merchantable trees taking care to minimize damage to white pine regeneration. Do not cut any tree marked with BLUE paint.
- Cut designated trees with one or more 100" sticks (pulp). The standard utilization is 5" minimum top diameter for aspen, oak, and mixed hardwood pulpwood, and to a 4" minimum top diameter for pine pulpwood.
- Pine products must be removed from the sale area within two weeks of harvest between April 1<sup>st</sup> and August 31<sup>st</sup> to minimize bark beetle buildup.
- All species and products must be cut concurrently when harvesting the timber. Logs and bolts may require scaling in the field. Bolts destined to a mill that buys on weight may be allowed to go on tickets.

ACCESS: Access to the sale is from woods roads coming west off of Weisner Rd. (see map). Landing sites can be established along these logging roads and must be approved by the forest administrator.

### RESTRICTIONS:

- The county may restrict the type of equipment used on the job if conditions or damage warrant.
- Seasonal Restrictions: Logging chance is dependent on ground and weather conditions. Soils are poorly drained in areas. Due to these issues logging may be limited to winter months.

### OTHER SALE REQUIREMENTS AND CONDITIONS:

• The logging contractor will be responsible for treating cut pine stumps with sporax or Cellu-Treat to prevent infection from Annosum root rot. Application of the fungicide is required on all pine stumps within 24 hours of cutting from April 1<sup>st</sup> through November 30<sup>th</sup>. Wood County will provide the fungicide if needed. Contractor should contact the forest administrator in advance to ensure an adequate supply is on hand.



SALE OBJECTIVES: The sale objective is to regenerate oak, aspen, and white pine forests using coppice and over-story removal harvests. Other objectives are to maintain mature oak and pine for wildlife values and to protect water quality in Hay Creek and East Fork Black River.

<u>CUTTING AREA DESCRIPTION:</u> There are three cutting units with boundaries marked by red or blue paint lines. The sale lies adjacent to a privately owned 80 acre parcel. The harvest areas consist of mature oak, aspen, and maple stands.

### **CUTTING REQUIREMENTS/SPECIFICATIONS:**

- Cut all merchantable black oak, aspen, and mixed hardwoods. Do not cut any white pine, white oak, and any other tree marked with green paint. No shearing is required.
- Take precautions to protect advance oak and pine regeneration, especially sapling regeneration.
- Cut designated trees with one or more 100" sticks (pulp) or with one or more 8'6" sawlogs. Sawlog minimum top diameter is 10" inside
  bark for an 8'6" sawlog. The standard utilization is 5" minimum top diameter for aspen, oak, and mixed hardwood pulpwood, and 4"
  minimum top diameter for pine.
- All species and products must be cut concurrently when harvesting the timber. Logs and bolts may require scaling in the field. Bolts destined to a mill that buys on weight may be allowed to go on tickets.
- All standing dead trees shall be left for wildlife values.
- No slash can be left across the blue paint lines.
- Biomass harvest may be allowed on this sale, however; bids will be evaluated based on traditional forest products and volumes listed above. Contractors interested in biomass harvest should contact the forest administrator.

ACCESS: Access to the sale is from a snowmobile trail coming off of Peterson Road. Additional road building will be needed to gain access into the cutting units. Landing sites must be approved by the forest administrator.

### RESTRICTIONS:

- The county may restrict the type of equipment used on the job if conditions or damage warrant.
- Seasonal Restrictions: Harvesting will be confined to July 16 through March 31 when ground conditions will support logging operations. It
  is likely harvesting will be restricted to winter months due to difficult access and wet site conditions between cutting units.
